### **MAJOR ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES**

## **Program Development and Grant Acquisition:**

- Lead the development of strategies, guidelines and tools for effective Maternal New-born and Child Health Promotion and Gender programs and projects.
- Ensure Maternal New-born and Child Health Promotion Program is adequately funded and supported with appropriate technical capacity for effective implementation.
- In collaboration with grant acquisition, establish donor linkages, develop and market fundraising concept papers and proposals for MNCH (Maternal Child Health and Nutrition) and Gender program for increased scale and impact.
- Define and apply operational benchmarks for all components of the MNCH and Gender Portfolio from work planning, monitoring, and capacity strengthening for increased access to improved Health for Mothers and Children.



- Ensure Maternal New-born and Child Health Promotion and Gender Portfolio is aligned to the National strategy and integrated into program intervention of other portfolio
- Lead in the sector specific and/or integrated research and learning initiatives by developing research concepts with the view to generate lessons and knowledge for improved programming, quality assurance and effectiveness.
- Provide technical support to knowledge management in generating innovations for positive health behaviors adoption in the community.
- Provide leadership in high quality project designs and re-designs, effective planning, monitoring and evaluation of Maternal New-Born and Child Promotion and Gender programs and projects.
- · Maintain situation awareness of potential public health emergencies and ensure readiness for sector response.
- Providing day-to-day management including planning, administration, and implementation and reporting decision making for the Maternal New-Born and Child Promotion and Gender Portfolio.
