PURPOSE OF POSITION:

As the Director, International Programs and Grants, you will lead a team of 14 professionals in the planning, coordination, and evaluation of World Vision Netherlands (WVN) programs and acquisition and management of public private partnerships and grants.

You will lead strategic thinking on the contribution of WVN to programming and the development of innovations and partnerships that enable delivery of quality programs and impact in child well-being.

As a Senior Leadership Team (SLT) member, you will lead the team from the Dutch support office, located in our modern office near Amersfoort Central Station, and will report to the CEO / Executive Board of WVN.

This key role is critical to the ongoing realization of the strategic vision and the impact for 10 million vulnerable children by 2025.

The objectives of the position include:

- Delivering against the 5 year strategy to impact 10 million most vulnerable children through WVN funded programs;
- Continue expansion of Area Programs including in fragile contexts;
- Continue to build and diversify the grants portfolio including oversight of EU and Nordic Donor strategic initiatives;
- · Lead and further build the WVN IPG team;
- Contribute to leading the organization in the current strategy as a member of the SLT;



- Raising the profile of WVN and maintain and build a partner network that delivers on strategy;
- Act and contribute as a twin-citizen between WVN and the wider World Vision Partnership on international programs and grants.
