Should have satisfactorily completed (# Phase/Part completion of the scope of work in a contract shall not be considered, however pre-determined phasing of the work will be accepted) three works, each of Rs. 3,86,532/- or two works, each of Rs. 4,83,165/- or one work of Rs. 7,73,064/- in single contract of similar nature in the field of "PA system /conferencing system" during last seven years ending on last date / extended date of submission of e-bid in India. The experience assessment of eligibility for qualifying PQQ (Env.-I) shall be based on the completed cost of one year AMC on pro- rata basis.

The experience certificates of works completed pre-GST era, Completion amount will be **divided by 1.12 (to exclude pre-GST tax of VAT 12%)** to make it as par with experience certificates of post GST era but excluding GST.

If, the experience certificates of works completed post GST era are inclusive of GST then Completion amount will be computed to make it as par with experience certificates of post GST era but excluding GST.

"The value of executed works shall be brought to current costing level by enhancing the actual value of work at simple rate of 7% per annum, calculated from the date of completion to the last date / extended date of submission of bid

Client certificate for experience should show the nature of work done, the value of work, date of start, date of completion as per agreement, actual date of completion and satisfactory completion of work. Tender showing work experience certificate from non-government/ non-PSU organizations should submit copy of tax deduction at Sources (TDS) Certificate(s) along with a certificate issued by registered Chartered Accountant, clearly specifying the name of work, total payment received against the work and TDS amount for the work.

- Should have annualized average financial turnover of **Rs. 2,89,899/-** against work executed during last three years ending 31<sup>st</sup> march of the previous financial year. As a proof, copy of Abridged Balance Sheet along with profit and loss account statement of the firm should be submitted along with the application. Tenderers showing continuous losses during the last three years in the balance sheet shall be summarily rejected.
- iii The tenderer should have a minimum net worth of Rs, 1,44,950/- issued by certified Chartered Accountants. (As per Annexure –2)

Scanned copy of all the Documents of Envelope-I mentioned above shall be submitted on the CPP Portal. Tender processing fee and EMD is required to be submitted only by online mode. The tenderer, whose Tender processing fee and EMD are not received, then their tenderers will be liable to be rejected.

#### Envelope-II: - The Financial e-Bid through CPP portal

All rates shall be quoted in the format provided and no other format is acceptable. If the price bid has been given as a standard BOQ format with the tender document, then the same is to be downloaded and to be filled by all the Tenderers. Tenderers are required to download the BOQ file, open it and complete the **blue coloured** (unprotected) cells with their respective financial quotes and other details (such as name of the Tenderer). No other cells should be changed. Once the details have been completed, the tenderer should save it and submit it online, without changing the filename. If the BOQ file is found to be modified by the tenderer, the bid will be rejected.

#### 3. **BID SUBMISSION**

The tenderer shall submit their application only at CPP portal https://etenders.gov.in/eprocure/app. Tenderers/Contractors are advised to follow the instruction provided in the tender document for online submission of bids. Tenders are required to upload the digitally signed file of scanned documents along with as per para 2. Bid Documents may be scanned with 100 dpi with black and white option which helps in reducing size of the scanned document.

Uploading of application in location other than specified above shall not be considered. Hard copy of application shall not be entertained.

- 4. Not more than one tender shall be submitted by one tenderer or tenderers having business relationship. Under no Circumstance will father and his son(S) or other close relations who have business relationship with one another (i.e. when one or more partner (s)/ director (s) are common) be allowed to tender for the same contract as separate competitors. If the bidder has any query related to the Bid Document of the work, they should use 'Seek Clarification 'on CPP portal to seek clarifications. No other means of communication in this regard shall be entertained.

If any clarification is needed from the tenderers about the deficiency in his uploaded documents in Envelope-I, he will be asked to provide it through CPP portal or email if required. The tenderer shall upload the requisite clarification/documents within time specified by AAI, failing which it shall be presumed that bidder does not have anything to submit and bid shall be evaluated accordingly.

The intimation regarding acceptance/rejection of their bids will be intimated to the tenders through CPP Portal.

# **INSTRUCTIONS FOR ONLINE BID SUBMISSION**

The bidders are required to submit soft copies of their bids electronically on the CPP Portal, using valid Digital Signature Certificates. The instructions given below are meant to assist the bidders in registering on the CPP Portal, prepare their bids in accordance with the requirements and submitting their bids online on the CPP Portal.

More information useful for submitting online bids on the CPP Portal may be obtained at: www.etenders.gov.in

#### **REGISTRATION**

- 1) Bidders are required to enroll on the e-Procurement module of the Central Public Procurement Portal (URL: <a href="https://www.etenders.gov.in">www.etenders.gov.in</a> by clicking on the link "Online bidder Enrolment" on the CPP Portal which is free of charge.
- 2) As part of the enrolment process, the bidders will be required to choose a unique username and assign a password for their accounts.
- 3) Bidders are advised to register their valid email address and mobile numbers as part of the registration process. These would be used for any communication from the CPP Portal.
- 4) Upon enrolment, the bidders will be required to register their valid Digital Signature Certificate (Class II or Class III Certificates with signing key usage) issued by any Certifying Authority recognized by CCA India (e.g. Sify / nCode / eMudra etc.), with their profile.
- 5) Only one valid DSC should be registered by a bidder. Please note that the bidders are responsible to ensure that they do not lend their DSC's to others which may lead to misuse.
- 6) Bidder then logs in to the site through the secured log-in by entering their user ID / password and the password of the DSC / e-Token.

#### SEARCHING FOR TENDER DOCUMENTS

- 1) There are various search options built in the CPP Portal, to facilitate bidders to search active tenders by several parameters. These parameters could include Tender ID, Organization Name, Location, Date, Value, etc. There is also an option of advanced search for tenders, wherein the bidders may combine a number of search parameters such as Organization Name, Form of Contract, Location, Date, Other keywords etc. to search for a tender published on the CPP Portal.
- 2) Once the bidders have selected the tenders they are interested in, they may download the required documents / tender schedules. These tenders can be moved to the respective 'My Tenders' folder. This would enable the CPP Portal to intimate the bidders through SMS / e-mail in case there is any corrigendum issued to the tender document.
- 3) The bidder should make a note of the unique Tender ID assigned to each tender, in case they want to obtain any clarification / help from the Helpdesk.

#### PREPARATION OF BIDS

- 1) Bidder should take into account any corrigendum published on the tender document before submitting their bids
- 2) Please go through the tender advertisement and the tender document carefully to understand the documents required to be submitted as part of the bid. Please note the number of covers in which the bid documents have to be submitted, the number of documents including the names and content of each of the document that need to be submitted. Any deviations from these may lead to rejection of the bid.
- 3) Bidder, in advance, should get ready the bid documents to be submitted as indicated in the tender document / schedule and generally, they can be in PDF / XLS / RAR / DWF/JPG formats. Bid documents may be scanned with 100 dpi with black and white option which helps in reducing size of the scanned document.
- 4) To avoid the time and effort required in uploading the same set of standard documents which are required to be submitted as a part of every bid, a provision of uploading such standard documents (e.g. PAN card copy, annual reports, auditor certificates etc.) has been provided to the bidders. Bidders can use "My Space" or "Other Important Documents" area available to them to upload such documents and keep it as a repository.

<u>Note:</u> My Documents space is only a repository given to the Bidders to ease the uploading process. If Bidder has uploaded his Documents in My Documents space, this does not automatically ensure these Documents being part of Technical Bid.

#### SUBMISSION OF BID

- 1) Bidder should log into the site well in advance for bid submission so that they can upload the bid in time i.e. on or before the bid submission time. Bidder will be responsible for any delay due to other issues.
- 2) The bidder has to digitally sign and upload the required bid documents one by one as indicated in the tender document.
- 3) Bidder has to select the payment option as "online" to pay the tender fee and EMD. Procedure to be followed for Online Collection of EMD and Tender Fee from Bidders is at Page NIC-GePNIC 1 to 20. If Tender Fee and EMD / (Certificate of MSE in the relevant category) are not received, then their tenders will be liable to be rejected.
- 4) Bidders are requested to note that they should necessarily submit their financial bids in the format provided and no other format is acceptable. If the price bid has been given as a standard BOQ format with the tender document, then the same is to be downloaded and to be filled by all the bidders. Bidders are required to download the BOQ file, open it and complete the **light blue coloured** (unprotected) cells with their respective financial quotes and other details (such as name of the bidder). No other cells should be changed. Once the details have been completed, the bidder should save it and submit it online, without changing the filename. If the BOQ file is found to be modified by the bidder, the bid will be rejected.
- 5) The server time (which is displayed on the bidders' dashboard) will be considered as the standard time for referencing the deadlines for submission of the bids by the bidders, opening of bids etc. The bidders should follow this time during bid submission.
- 6) All the documents being submitted by the bidders would be encrypted using PKI encryption techniques to ensure the secrecy of the data. The data entered cannot be viewed by unauthorized persons until the time of bid opening. The confidentiality of the bids is maintained using the secured Socket Layer 128-bit encryption

technology. Data storage encryption of sensitive fields is done. Any bid document that is uploaded to the server is subjected to symmetric encryption using a system generated symmetric key. Further this key is subjected to asymmetric encryption using buyers/bid openers' public keys. Overall, the uploaded tender documents become readable only after the tender opening by the authorized bid openers.

- 7) The uploaded tender documents become readable only after the tender opening by the authorized bid openers.
- 8) Upon the successful and timely submission of bids (i.e. after Clicking "Freeze Bid Submission" in the portal), the portal will give a successful bid submission message & a bid summary will be displayed with the bid no. and the date & time of submission of the bid with all other relevant details.

- 12. All rates shall be quoted in the format provided on CPP portal and no other format is acceptable.
- 13. As this tender is an Item rate Tender, rates for all items quoted shall only be considered. Any Tender containing percentage below/above the total estimated cost is liable to be rejected. Tenderers which propose any alteration in the works specified in the said form of invitation to tender, or in the time allowed for carrying out the work, or which contain any other conditions of any sort including conditional rebates will be summarily rejected. Any Tender containing percentage below/above the rates quoted is liable to be rejected

- 1. This book of "General Conditions of Contract" is applicable to both types of tendersi. e." Percentage rate tenders and Item rate tenders". Accordingly, alternative provisions for conditions Nos. 4, 10 & 12 of the General Rules and Directions are given in this book. The appropriate alternatives will be applicable in specific cases depending on whether this is used for percentage rate tenders or item ratetenders
- 2. Notice Inviting Tender, Schedules A to F, special conditions/specifications and drawings only will be issued to intending bidders. The standard form will not be issued along with the Tender Documents but the same shall form part of the agreement to be drawn and signed by both parties after acceptance oftender.
- 3. All blanks are confined to Notice Inviting Tender and Schedules A toF.
- 4. Authority approving the Notice Inviting Tenders (NIT) shall fill up all the blanks in Notice Inviting Tender and in Schedules B to F before issue of Tenderdocuments.
- 5. The intending bidders will quote their rates in ScheduleA.
- 6. The proforma for registers and Schedules A to F are only for information and guidance. These are not to be filled in the Standard Form. The Schedules with all blanks, duly filled, shall be separately issued to all intendingtenderers.

General Rules & Directions	All work proposed for execution by contract are notified in a form of invitation to tender pasted in public places /NIC CPP Portal and signed by the officer inviting tender or by publication in Newspapers and posted on AAI web-site and NIC CPP Portal <a href="http://etenders.gov.in/and/www.aai.aero">http://etenders.gov.in/and/www.aai.aero</a> (for referenceonly). This form will state the work to be carried out, as well as the date for submitting and opening tenders and the time allowed for carrying out the work, also the amount of earnest money to be deposited with the tender, and the amount of the security deposit and Performance guarantee to be deposited by the successful tenderer and the percentage, if any, to be deducted from bills. Copies of the specifications, designs and drawings and any other documents required in connection with the work signed for the purpose of identification by the officer inviting tender shall also be open for inspection by the contractor at the office of Officer inviting tender during office hours.
2.		In the event of the e-tender being submitted by a firm, it must be digitally signed. Such tender will be treated as signed tender. For physical tender it must be signed separately by each partner thereof or in the event of the absence of any partner, it must be signed on his behalf by a person holding a power-of-attorney authorizing him to do so, such power of attorney to be produced with the tender, and it must disclose that the firm is duly registered under the Indian Partnership Act, 1952.

1.	The contract means the documents forming the tender and acceptance thereof and the formal agreement / agreements executed between the competent authority(s) on behalf of the Chairman, Airports Authority of India and the Contractor, together with the documents referred to therein including these conditions, thespecifications, designs, drawings and instructions issued from time to time by the Engineer-in-Charge and all these documents taken together, shall be deemed to form one contract / two contracts and shall be complimentary to one another. Contractor has to sign two agreements, one consisting BOQ for Civil works and another one for SITC and O&M /AMC / AICMC part.Engineer-in charge could be common for both the agreements. Separate invoices for the civil /construction works and SITC / O&M / AICMC / AMC works have to be raised by the agency referring to the respective agreements to facilitate AAI to claim input tax credit on such SITC / O&M / AICMC / AMC works as mentioned in Schedule 'F' para 2(v).
2.	In the contract, the following expressions shall, unless the context otherwise requires, have the meanings, hereby respectively assigned to them:-

Guarantee	is more than Rs.5 crores.

The contractor shall submit an irrevocable Performance Guarantee of 5% (Five percent) of the Tendered amount in addition to other deposits mentioned elsewhere in the contract for his proper performance of the contract agreement, (not withstanding and/or without prejudice to any other provisions in the contract) within period specified in Schedule 'F' from the date of issue of award letter. This guarantee shall be in the form of Fixed Deposit Receipts or Guarantee Bonds of any Scheduled bank but not Cooperative or Gramine bank in accordance with the form annexed hereto.(Appendix-XI) In case a fixed deposit receipts of any Bank is furnished by the contractor to the AAI as part of the performance guarantee and the Bank is unable to make payment against the said fixed deposit receipts or Guarantee Bonds, the loss caused thereby shall fall on the contractor and the contractor shall forthwith on demand furnishadditional security to make good the deficit.
	ii Performance guarantee should be furnished within 30 days of issue of award letter. In case the contractor fails to deposit performance guarantee within the stipulated period, no payment will be released to the contractor for the work done in respect of 1 <sup>st</sup> running account bill. Moreover, interest @10% per annum on performance guarantee amount would be levied(non-refundable) for delayed period of submission.
	iii. The Performance Guarantee shall be initially valid upto the stipulated date of completion plus 180 days beyond that. In case the time for completion of work gets enlarged, the contractor shall get the validity of Performance Guarantee extended to cover such enlarged time for completion of work. After recording of the completion certificate for the work by the competent authority, the performance guarantee shall be returned to the contractor, without any interest. However, in case of contracts involving maintenance of buildings and services / any other work thereafter, 50% of Performance Guarantee shall be retained as Security Deposit as per contract conditions. The same shall be returned on successful completion of commitment year wise proportionately.

#### **CLAUSE 1 A**

### Recovery of Security Deposit

The person/persons whose tender(s) may be accepted (hereinafter called the contractor) shall permit AAI at the time of making any payment to him for work done under the contract to deduct a sum at the rate of 5% of the gross amount of each running and final bill till the sum deducted alongwith the sum already deposited as earnest money, will amount to security deposit of 5% of the tendered value of the work. Earnest money shall be adjusted first in the security deposit and further recovery of security deposit shall commence only when the update amount of security deposit starts exceeding the earnest money. Such deductions will be made and held by way of Security Deposit unless he/they has/have deposited the amount of Security at the rate mentioned above in the form of fixed deposit receipts or guarantee bonds of any Scheduled Bank but not Co-operative or Gramin Bank. In case a fixed deposit receipts or Guarantee Bonds of any Bank is furnished by the contractor to the AAI as part of the security deposit and the Bank is unable to make payment against the said fixed deposit receipt or Guarantee Bond, the loss caused thereby shall fall on the contractor and the contractor shall forthwith on demand furnish additional security to the AAI to make good the deficit. In works where condition of submission of performance guarantee is not applicable, the security deposit at the rate of 10% (Ten Percent) of gross amount of each running bill shall be deducted instead of 5%, till the sum along with the sum already deposited as earnest money will amount to security deposit of 10% of the contract value of work. Other conditions shall remain same as stated above. All compensations or the other sums of money payable by the contractor under the terms of this contract may be deducted from, or paid by the sale of a sufficient part of his security deposit or from the interest arising therefrom, or from any sums which may be due to or may become due to the contractor by AAI on any account whatsoever and in the event of his Security Deposit being reduced by reason of any such deductions or sale as aforesaid, the contractor shall within 10 days make good in fixed deposit receipts or Guarantee Bonds tendered by the Scheduled Banks (but not any Co-operative or Gramin bank) (if deposited for more than 12 months) endorsed in favour of the Airports Authority of India, any sum or sums which may have been deducted from, or raised by sale of his security deposit or any part thereof. The security deposit shall be collected from the running bills of the contractor at the rates mentioned above and the Earnest money deposited at the time of tenders will be treated as part of the Security Deposit. The security deposit as deducted above can be released against bank guarantee issued by any Scheduled Bank (but not from Cooperative / GraminBank), on its accumulations to a minimum of Rs. 5 lakh subject to the condition that amount of such bank guarantee, except last one, shall not be less than Rs. 5lakh.

**Note 1:** Provided further that the validity of Bank Guarantee including the one given against the earnest money shall be in conformity with provisions contained in the clause 17 which shall be extended from time to time depending upon extension of contract under provision of Clause 2 & Clause 5.

**Note 2:** Note 1 above shall be applicable for both clause 1 and 1 A.

The compensation for delay, if not decided before the determination of contract, shall be decided after of determination of contract.

The amount of compensation may be adjusted or set-off against any sum payable to the' Contractor under this or any other contract with AAI. In case, the contractor does not achieve a particular milestone mentioned in schedule F, or the re-scheduled milestone(s) in terms of Clause 5.4, the amount shown against that milestone shall be withheld, to be adjusted against the compensation levied as above. With-holding of this amount on failure to achieve a milestone, shall be automatic without any notice to the contractor. However, if the contractor catches up with the progress of work on the subsequent milestone(s), the withheld amount shall be released. In case the contractor fails to make up for the delay in subsequent milestone(s), amount mentioned against each milestone missed subsequentlyalsoshallbewithheld. However, no interest, what so ever, shall be payable on such withheld amount.

In case, the contractor completes the work ahead of stipulated date of completion, a bonus @ 1 % (one per cent) of the tendered value per month computed on per day basis, shall be payable to the contractor, subject to a maximum limit of 5% (five per cent) of the tendered value. The amount of bonus, if payable, shall be paid along with final bill after completion of work. Provided always that provision ofthe Clause 2A shall be applicable only when so provided in 'Schedule F'. This clause shall be applicable for the work which estimated cost put to tender is Rs. 50.00 Cr. and above for pavement work and Rs.100.00 Cr. and above for building work.

Withheld amount towards compensation for delay over and above Rs. 50.00 lacs, can be released against Bank Guarantee (on the format given at Appendix-1) or in the form of fixed deposit receipts or guarantee bonds of any Scheduled Bank but not Co-operative or Gramin Bank, pending finalization of case of extension of time by competent authority as per delegation of powers. Concerned Executive Director (Engg) will authorize such action on receipt of proposal from the Engineer-In-Charge through proper channel.

Subject to other provisions contained in this clause, the Engineer-in-Charge may, without prejudice to his any other rights or remedy against the contractor in respectofanydelay,inferiorworkmanship,anyclaimsfordamagesand/oranyother provisions of this contract or otherwise, and whether the date of completion has or has note lapsed, by notice inwriting absolutely determine the contract in any



of the following cases:

- i. If the contractor having been given a notice by the Engineer-in-Charge in writing to rectify, reconstruct or replace any defective work or that the work is being performed in an inefficient or otherwise improper or un-workman like manner shall omit to comply with the requirement of such notice for a period of seven daysthereafter.
- **ii.** If the contractor has, without reasonable cause, suspended the progress of the work or has failed to proceed with the work with due diligence and continues to do so after a notice in writing of seven days from the Engineer- in-Charge.
- iii. If the contractor fails to complete the work or section of work with individual date of completion on or before the stipulated or justified extended date on or before such date of completion, and the Engineer in Charge without any prejudice to any other right or remedy under any other provision in the contract has given further reasonable time in a notice given in writing in that behalf as either mutually agreed or in absence of such mutual agreement by his own assessment making such time essence of contract and in the opinion of Engineer in Charge, the contractor will be unable to complete the same or does not complete the same within the periodspecified.
- **iv.** If the contractor persistently neglects to carry out his obligations under the contract and / or commits default in complying with any of the terms and conditions of the contract and does not remedy it or take effective steps to remedy it within 7 days after a notice in writing is given to him in that behalf by the Engineer-in-Charge.
- v. If the contractor shall offer or give or agree to give to any person in AAI service or to any other person on his behalf any gift or consideration of any kind as an inducement or reward for doing or forbearing to do or for having done or forborne to do any act in relation to the obtaining or execution of this or any other contract forAAI.
- vi. If the contractor shall enter into a contract with Airports Authority of India in connection with which commission has been paid or agreed to be paid by him or to his knowledge, unless the particulars of any such commission and the terms of payment thereof have been previously disclosed in writing to the Engineer-in-charge.
- vii. If the contractor shall obtain a contract with AAI as a result of wrong tendering or other non-bonafide methods of competitive tendering or commits any breach of IntegrityPact.
- viii. If the contractor being an individual, or if a firm, any partner thereof shall at any time be adjudged insolvent or have a receiving order or order for administration of his estate made against him or shall take any proceedings for liquidation or composition (other than a voluntary liquidation for the purpose of amalgamation or reconstruction) under any Insolvency Act for the time being in force or make any conveyance or assignment of his effects or composition or arrangement for the benefit of his creditors or purport so to do, or if any application be made under any Insolvency Act for the time being in force for the sequestration of his estate or if a trust deed be executed by him for benefit of hiscreditors.
- ix. If the contractor being a company shall pass a resolution or the court shall make an order that the company shall be wound up or if a receiver or a manager on behalf of a creditor shall be appointed or if circumstances shall arise which entitle the court or the creditor to appoint a receiver or a manager or which entitle the court to make a winding uporder.
- **x.** If the contractor shall suffer an execution being levied on his goods and allow it to be continued for a period of 21days.



- xi. If the contractor assigns (excluding part(s) of work assigned to other agency(s) by the contractor as per terms of contract), transfers, sublets (engagement of labour on a piece-work basis or of labour with materials not to be incorporated in the work, shall not be deemed to be subletting) or otherwise parts with or attempts to assign, transfer, sublet or otherwise parts with the entire works or any portion thereof without the prior written approval of the Engineer-in-Charge. When the contractor has made himself liable for action under any of the cases aforesaid, the Engineer-in-Charge on behalf of the Chairman, AAI shall have powers:
  - a. To determine the contract as aforesaid so far as performance of work by the Contractor of work is concerned (of which determination notice in writing to the contractor under the hand of the Engineer-in-Charge shall be conclusive evidence). Upon such determination, the Earnest Money Deposit, Security Deposit already recovered and Performance Guarantee under the contract shall be liable to be forfeited and shall be absolutely at the disposal of the AAI.
  - After giving notice to the contractor to measure up the work of the contractor and to take such whole, or the balance or part thereof, as shall be un-executed out of his hands and to give it to another contractor or any other means to complete the work. The contractor, whose contract is determined as above, shall not be allowed to participate in the tendering process for the balance work. In the event of above courses being adopted by the Engineer-in-Charge, the contractor shall have no claim to compensation for any loss sustained by him by reasons of his having purchased or procured any materials or entered into any engagements or made any advances on account or with a view to the execution of the work or the performance of the contract. And in case action is taken under any of the provision aforesaid, the contractor shall not be entitled to recover or be paid any sum for any work thereof or actually performed under this contract unless and until the Engineer-in-Charge has certified in writing the performance of such work and the value payableinrespectthereofandheshallonlybeentitledtobepaidthe value so certified.

#### **CLAUSE 3 A**

In case, the work cannot be started due to reasons not within the control of the contractor within 1/8th of the stipulated time for completion of work or one month whichever is higher, either party may close the contract by giving notice to the other party stating the reasons. In such eventuality, the Earnest Money Deposit and the Performance Guarantee of the contractor shall be refunded within 30 days.

Neither party shall claim any compensation for such eventuality. This clause is not applicable for any breach of the contract by eitherparty.

In the event of the Engineer-in-Charge putting in force all or any of the powers vested in him under the preceding clause he may, if he so desires after giving a notice in writing to the contractor, take possession of (or at the sole discretion of the Engineer-in-Charge which shall be final and binding on the contractor) use as on hire (the amount of the hire money being also in the final determination of the Engineer-in-Charge) all or any tools, plant, materials and stores, in or upon the works, or the site thereof belonging to the contractor, or procured by the contractor and intended to be used for the execution of the work/ or any part thereof, paying or allowing for the same in account at the contract rates, or, in the case of these not being applicable, at current market rates to be certified by the Engineer-in-Charge, whose certificate thereof shall be final, and binding on the contractor, clerk of the works, foreman or other authorised agent to remove such tools, plant, materials, or stores from the premises (within a time to be specified in such notice) in the event of the contractor failing to comply with any such requisition, the Engineerin-Charge may remove them at the contractor's expense or sell them by auction or private sale on account of the contractor and his risk in all respects and the certificate of the Engineer-in-Charge as to the expenses of any such removal and the amount of the proceeds and expenses of any such sale shall be final andconclusive against the contractor.

In case of delay in payment of final bills after prescribed time limit, a simple interest @ 5% per annum shall be paid to the contractor from the date of expiry of prescribed time limit which will be compounded on yearly basis, provided the final bill submitted by the contractor found to be in order.

The Final bill shall be prepared for both L1 & L2 bidders for all tendered items (excluding Extra Items based on market rate) and payment shall be made on the basis of lower of the two.

# Payment of contractor's bills to Banks

Payments due to the contractor and refund of various nature may, if so desired by him and wherever possible in banks be made through electronic payment mechanism instead of direct to him, provided that the contractor furnishes to the Engineer-in-Charge.

- ii. An authorization in the form of a legally valid document such as power of attorney conferring authority on the bank to receive payments and
- iii. His own acceptance of the correctness of the amount made out as being due to him by Authority or his signature on the bill or other claim preferred against Authority before settlement by the Engineer-in-charge of the account or claim by payment to the bank. While the receipt given by such banks shall constitute a full and sufficient discharge for the payment, the contractor shall whenever possible present his bills duly receipted and discharged through hisbank.

Nothing herein contained shall operate to create in favour of the bank any rights or equities vis-à-vis the Airports Authority of India.

# Materials supplied by Authority

Materials which Authority will supply are shown in Schedule 'B' which also stipulates quantum, place of issue and rate(s) to be charged in respect thereof. The contractor shall be bound to procure them from the Engineer-in-charge.

As soon as the work is awarded, the contractor shall finalise the programme for the completion of work as per clause 5 of this contract and shall give his estimates of materials required on the basis of drawings/ or schedule of quantities of the work. The contractor shall give in writing his requirement to the Engineer-in-charge, which shall be issued to him keeping in view the progress of work as assessed by the Engineer-in- Charge in accordance with the agreed phased programme of work indicating monthly requirements of various materials. The contractor shall place his indent in writing for issue of such materials at least 7 days in advance of hisrequirement.

Such materials shall be supplied for the purpose of the contract only and the value of the materials so supplied at the rates specified in the aforesaid schedule shall be set off or deducted, as and when materials are consumed in items of work (including normal wastage) for which payment is being made to the contractor, form any sum then due or which may therefore become due to the contractor under the contract or otherwise or from the security deposit. At the time of submission of bills, the contractor shall certify that balance of materials supplied is available at site in original good condition.

The contractor shall submit along with every running bill (on account or interim bill) material-wise reconciliation statements supported by complete calculations



reconciling total issue, total consumption and certified balance (diameter/section-wise in the case of steel) and resulting variations and reasons thereof. Engineer-in-charge shall (whose decision shall be final and binding on the contractor) be within his rights to follow the procedure of recovery in clause 42 at any stage of the work if reconciliation is not found to be satisfactory.

The contractor shall bear the cost of getting the material issued, loading, transporting to site, unloading, storing under cover as required, cutting assembling and joining the several parts together as necessary. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any other clause of the contract and all stores / materials so supplied to the contractor or procured with the assistance of the AAI shall remain the absolute property of Authority and the contractor shall be the trustee of the stores/ materials, and the said stores/ materials shall not be removed/ disposed off from the site of the work on any account and shall be at all times open to inspection by the Engineer-in-charge or his authorised agent. Any such stores/ materials remaining unused shall be returned to the Engineerin-charge in as good a condition in which they were originally supplied at a place directed by him, at a place of issue or any other place specified by him as he shall require, but in case it is decided not to take back the stores/ materials the contractor shall have no claim for compensation on any account of such stores/ materials so supplied to him as aforesaid and not used by him or for any wastage in or damage to in such stores/materials.

On being required to return the stores/ materials, the contractor shall hand over the stores/ materials on being paid or credited such price as the Engineer-incharge shall determine, having due regard to the condition of the stores/ materials. The price allowed for credit to the contractor, however, shall be at the prevailing market rate not exceeding the amount charged to him, excluding the storage charge, if any. The decision of the Engineer-in-charge shall be final and conclusive. In the event of breach of the aforesaid condition, the contractor shall in addition to throwing himself open to account for contravention of the terms of the licenses or permit and/ or for criminal breach of trust, be liable to Authority for all advantages or profits resulting or which in the usual course would have resulted to him by reason of such breach. Provided that the contractor shall in no case be entitled to any compensation or damages on account of any delay in supply or non-supply thereof all or any such materials and stores provided further that the contractor shall be bound to execute the entire work if the materials are supplied by the Authority within the original scheduled time for completion of the work plus 50% thereof or schedule time plus 6 months whichever is more if the time of completion of work exceeds 12 months, but if a part of the materials only has been supplied within the aforesaid period, then the contractor shall be bound to do so much of the work as may be possible with the materials and stores supplied in the aforesaid period. For the completion of the rest of the work, the contractor shall be entitled to such extension of time as may be determined by the Engineer-in-charge whose decision in this regard shall be final and binding on the contractor.

The contractor shall see that only the required quantities of materials are got issued. Any such material remaining unused and in perfectly good/ original condition at the time of completion or determination of the contract shall be returned to the Engineer-in- charge at the stores from which it was issued or at a place directed by him by a notice in writing. The contractor shall not be entitled for loading transporting, unloading and stacking of such unused material except for the extra lead, if any involved, beyond the original place of issue.





## Materials to be provided by the contractor and Mandatory Tests

- 1. The contractor shall, at his own expense, provide all materials, required for the works other than those which are stipulated to be supplied by the Authority.
- 2. The contractor shall, at his own expense and without delay; supply to the Engineer in- charge samples of materials to be used on the work and shall get these approved in advance. All such materials to be provided by the contractor shall be in conformity with the specifications laid down or referred to in the contract. The contractor shall, if requested by the Engineer-in-charge furnish proof, to the satisfaction of the Engineer-in-charge that the materials so comply. The Engineer-in-charge shall within thirty days of supply of samples or within such further period as he may require intimate to the Contractor in writing whether samples are approved by him or not. If samples are not approved, the Contractor shall forthwith arrange to supply to the Engineer-in charge for his approval, fresh samples complying with the specifications laid down in the contract. When materials are required to be tested in accordance with specifications, approval of the Engineer-in-charge shall be issued after the test results are received.
- 3. The contractor shall at his risk and cost submit the samples of materials to be tested or analyzed and shall not make use of or incorporate in the work any materials represented by the samples until the required tests or analysis have been made and materials finally accepted by the Engineer-in-charge.
- 4. If any additional tests apart from mandatory tests specified in the contract are required to be carried out at the instance of AAI or any other advisory body, to ensure conformity of the item to the contract specifications, the cost of such tests shall be borne by AAI. In case the material / equipment fails in the above tests, the expenditure incurred by AAI on testing of such material or equipment along with incidental charges borne by AAI (if any) shall be recovered from the dues of the contractor and action shall be taken under Clause 16 and other relevant clauses of thecontract.
- 5. The contractor shall not be eligible for any claim or compensation either arising out of any delay in the work or due to any corrective measures required to be taken on account of and as a result of testing ofmaterials.
- 6. The contractor shall, at his risk and cost, make all arrangements and shall provide all facilities as the Engineer-in-charge may require for collecting and preparing the required number of samples for such tests at such time and to such place or places as may be directed by the Engineer-in-charge and bear all charges and cost of testing unless specifically provided for otherwise elsewhere in the contract or specifications. The Engineer-in-charge or his authorised representative shall at all times have access to the works and to all workshops and places where work is being prepared or from where materials manufactured, articles or machinery are being obtained for the works and the contractor shall afford every facility and every assistance in obtaining the right to suchaccess.
- 7. The Engineer-in-charge shall have full powers to require the removal from the premises of all materials which in his opinion are not in accordance with the specifications and in case of default, the Engineer-in-charge shall be at liberty to employ at the expense of the contractor, other persons to remove the same without being answerable or accountable for any loss or damage that may happen or arise to such materials. The Engineer-in-charge shall also have full powers to require other proper materials to be substituted thereof and in case of default, the Engineer-in-charge may cause



the same to be supplied and all costs which may be attracted for such removal and substitution shall be borne by the Contractor.
8. The contractor shall at his own expense, provide a material testing lab at
the site for conducting routine field tests. The lab shall be equipped atleast with the testing equipment as specified in ScheduleF.
9. Details in respect of all mandatory tests shall be maintained in the desired
format and attached with each Running AccountBill.

Such secured advance shall be paid on submission of Collateral Bank Guarantee submitted by the vendor against the payment in case equipment/system fails to perform on testing and commissioning. Normally secured advance is paid up to 75% of the assessed value of items but in any case it shall not exceed 80% of cost of items indicated for supply of equipment.

Authority shall in respect of materials incorporated in the works (excluding the material covered under clause 10CA and not being materials supplied from the Engineer-in-charge's stores in accordance with Clause 10 hereof) and/ or labour engaged on the execution of the work after the date of coming into force of such law, statutory rule or order be entitled to deduct from the dues of the contractor, such amount as shall be equivalent to the difference between the prices of the materials and/ or wages as prevailed at the time of the last stipulated date for receipt of tenders including extensions if any for the work and the prices of materials and/ or wages of labour on the coming into force of such law, statutory rule or order. This will be applicable for the contract period including the justified period extended under the provisions of clause 5 of the contract without any action under clause2.

Engineer-in-charge shall call books of account and other relevant documents from the contractor to satisfy himself about reasonability of increase in prices of materials and wages. The contractor shall, within a reasonable time of his becoming aware of any alteration in the price of any such materials and/ or wages of labour, give notice thereof to the Engineer-in-charge stating that the same is given pursuant to this condition together with all information relating thereto which he may be in position to supply.

For this purpose, the labour component of 85% of the value of the work executed during period under consideration shall not exceed the percentage as specified in Schedule F, and the increase / decrease in labour shall be considered on the minimum daily wages in rupees of any unskilled mazdoor,

fixed under any law, statutory rule or order.

The cost of work for which escalation applicable (w) is same as cost of work done as worked out as indicated in clause 10 CC minus the amount of full assessed value of secured advances.

  - c. Irrespective of vertiations in annimum wages of any category of labour, for the pure se of this clause, the variation in the rate for an unskilled in vertical parameters and the second contents for payable on the labourcomponent.
- viii. In the event the price of materials and/ or wages of labour required for evention of the work decrease/s, there shall be a downward adjustment of the cost of work so that such price of materials and/ or wages of labour shall be deductible from the cost of work under this contract and in this regard the formula herein before stated under this Clause 10CC shall mutatis mutandis apply, providedthat:
  - a. No such adjustment for the decrease in the price of materials and/or wages of labour aforementioned would be made in case of contracts in which the stipulated period of completion of the work is equal to or less than the time as specified in ScheduleF.
  - b. The Engineer-in-charge shall otherwise be entitled to be down the procedure by which the provision of this to be clause shall be implemented from time to time and the accision of the Higineer-in-charge in this behalf shall be final and bit ling on the entractor.
- ix. Provided always that:
  - a. Where provisions of clause 10°CC at application provisions of clause 10°CC will not be applicable but provisions of clause 10°CA will be applicable.
  - b. Where provious of chase LCC are not applicable, provisions of Chase LCC and LOCA will become applicable.
- Note: Up steed tipulated rate of completion (period of completion plus extra time for carra work for compensation under clause 10C, 10CA and 10CC, the factor of K.25 taken into account for calculating the extra time under clause 12.7 for extra time shall not be considered while calculating the updated stipulated date of completion for this purpose in clause 10C. clause 10CA, and clause 10CC.

The date of preparation of bill shall be as finally entered in the measurement book by AM / Mgr. / SM / AGM or the date of submission of bill by the contractor to the Department. This shall be the guiding factor to decide the bill relevant to that period in case of computerized billing.

Work to be executed in accordance with specifications, drawings, orders etc.

The contractor shall execute the whole and every part of the work in the most substantial and workmanlike manner both as regards materials and otherwise in every respect in strict accordance with the specifications. The contractor shall also conform exactly, fully and faithfully to the design, drawings and instructions in writing in respect to the work signed by the Engineer in charge and the contractor shall be furnished free of charge one copy of the contract documents together with specifications, designs, drawings and instructions as are not included in the standard specifications of Central Public Works Department specified in Schedule F or in any Bureau of Indian Standard or any other published standard or code or Schedule of Rates or any other printed publication referred to elsewhere in the contract. The contractor shall comply with the provisions of the contract and with the care and diligence execute and maintain the works and provide all labour and materials, tools and plants including for measurements and supervision of all works, structural plans and other things of temporary or permanent nature required for such execution and maintenance in so far as the necessity for providing these, is specified or is reasonably inferred from the contract. The contractor shall take full responsibility for adequacy suitability and safety of all the works and methods of construction.

## **CLAUSE12**

	Deviations / variations extent and pricing	The engineer-in-charge shall have power (i) to make alteration in, omissions from, additions to, or substitutions for the original specifications, drawings, designs and instructions that may appear to him to be necessary or advisable during the progress of the work, and (ii) to omit a part of the works in case of non-availability of a portion of the site or for any other reasons and the contractor shall be bound to carry out the works in accordance with any instructions given to him in writing signed by the Engineering- charge and such alterations, omissions, additions or substitutions shall form part of the contract as if originally provided therein and any altered, additional or substituted work which the contractor may be directed to do in the manner specified above as part of the works, shall be carried out by the contractor on the same conditions in all respects including price on which he agreed to do the main work except as hereafterprovided.

In the proportion which the additional cost of the altered, additional or substituted work, bears to the original tendered valueplus  ii. 25% of the time calculated in (i) above or such further additional time as may be considered reasonable by theengineer-in-charge.
12.2	Deviation, Extra Items and Pricing	In the case of extra item(s) (items that are completely new, and in addition to the items contained in the contract) the contractor may within fifteen days of receipt of order or occurrence of the item(s) claim rates, supported by proper analysis, for the work and the Engineer-in-charge shall within Six weeks of the receipt of the claims supported by analysis, after giving consideration to the analysis of the rates submitted by the contractor, determine the rates on the basis of the market rates and the contractor shall be paid in accordance with the rates sodetermined.

- Any expenditure incurred on preliminary site work, e.g. temporary access roads, temporary labour huts, staff quarters and site office; storage accommodation and water storagetanks.
- ii. AAI shall have the option to take over contractor's materials or any part thereof either brought to site or of which the contractor is legally bound to accept delivery from suppliers (for incorporation in or incidental to the work) provided, however AAI shall be bound to take over the materials or such portions thereof as the contractor does not desire to retain. For materials taken over or to be taken over by AAI, cost of such materials as detailed by Engineer-in- Charge shall be paid. The cost shall, however, take into account purchase price, cost of transportation and deterioration or damage which may have been caused to materials whilst in the custody of the contractor.
- If any materials supplied by AAI are rendered surplus, the same except normal wastage shall be returned by the contractor to AAI at rates not exceeding those at which these were originally issued, less allowance for any deterioration or damage which may have been caused whilst the materials were in the custody of the contractor. In addition, cost of transporting such materials from site to AAI stores, if so required by AAI, shall bepaid.



- iv. Reasonable compensation for transfer of T & P from site to contractor's permanent stores or to his other works, whichever is less. If T & P are not transported to either of the said places, no cost of transportation shall be payable.
- v. Reasonable compensation for repatriation of contractor's site staff and imported labour to the extentnecessary.

The contractor shall, if required by the Engineer- in-Charge, furnish to him, books of account, wage books, time sheets and other relevant documents and evidence as may be necessary to enable him to certify the reasonable amount payable under this condition.

The reasonable amount of items on (i), (iv) and (v) above shall not be in excess of 2% of the cost of the work remaining incomplete on the date of closure, i.e. total stipulated cost of the work as per accepted tender less the cost of work actually executed under the contract and less the cost of contractor's materials at site taken over by the AAI as per item (ii) above. Provided always that against any payments due to the contractor on this account or otherwise, the Engineer-in-Charge shall be entitled to recover or be credited with any outstanding balances due from the contractor for advance paid in respect of any tool, plants and materials and any other sums which at the date of termination were recoverable by the AAI from the contractor under the terms of the contract.

In the event of action being taken under clause 13 to reduce the scope of work, the contractor may furnish fresh Performance Guarantee on the same conditions, in the same manner and at the same rate for the balance tendered amount and initially valid upto the extended date the completion or stipulated date of completion if no extension has been granted plus 180 days beyond that. Wherever, such a fresh Performance Guarantee is furnished by the contractor, the Engineer in Charge may return the previous PerformanceGuarantee.

## **CLAUSE 14**

## Carrying out part Work at risk & cost of contractor

## a. If contractor:

- i. At any time makes default during currency of work or does not execute any part of the work with due diligence and continues to do so even after a notice in writing of 7 days in this respect from the Engineer-in-Charge; or
- ii. Commits default in complying with any of the terms and conditions of the contract and does not remedy it or takes effective steps to remedy it within 7 days even after a notice in writing is given in that behalf by the Engineer-in-Charge; or
- iii. Fails to complete the work(s) or items of work with individual dates of completion, on or before the date(s) so determined, and does not complete them within the period specified in the notice given in writing in that behalf by the Engineer-in-Charge.
- b. The Engineer- in-Charge without invoking action under clause 3 may, without prejudice to any other right or remedy against the contractor which have either accrued or accrue thereafter to AAI, by a notice in writing to take the part work / part incomplete work of any item(s) out of his hands and shall have powersto:
  - i. Take possession of the site and any materials, constructional plant, implements, stores, etc., thereon;and/or
  - ii. Carry out the part work / part incomplete work of any item(s) by any means at the risk and cost of the contractor.



- c. The Engineer-in-Charge shall determine the amount, if any, is recoverable from the contractor for completion of the part work/ part incomplete work of any item(s) taken out of his hands and executed at the risk and cost of the contractor, the liability of contractor on account of loss or damage suffered by AAI because of action under this clause shall not exceed 10% of the tendered value of thework.
- d. In determining the amount, credit shall be given to the contractor with the value of work done in all respect in the same manner and at the same rate as if it had been carried out by the original contractor under the terms of his contract, the value of contractor's materials taken over and incorporated in the work and use of plant and machinery belonging to the contractor. The certificate of the Engineer-in-Charge as to the value of work done shall be final and conclusive against the contractor provided always that action under this clause shall only be taken after giving notice in writing to the contractor. Provided also that if the expenses incurred by the department are less than the amount payable to the contractor at his agreement rates, the difference shall not be payable to thecontractor.
- e. Any excess expenditure incurred or to be incurred by AAI in completing the part work/ part incomplete work of any item(s) or the excess loss of damages suffered or may be suffered by AAI as aforesaid after allowing such credit shall without prejudice to any other right or remedy available to AAI in law or per as agreement be recovered from any money due to the contractor on any account, and if such money is insufficient, the contractor shall be called upon in writing and shall be liable to pay the same within 30days.
- f. If the contractor fails to pay the required sum within the aforesaid period of 30 days, the Engineer-in-Charge shall have the right to sell any or all of the contractors' unused materials, constructional plant, implements, temporary building at site etc. and adjust the proceeds of sale thereof towards the dues recoverable from the contractor under the contract and if thereafter there remains any balance outstanding, it shall be recovered in accordance with the provisions of the contract/provisions oflaw.

In the event of above course being adopted by the Engineer-in-Charge, the contractor shall have no claim to compensation for any loss sustained by him by reason of his having purchased or procured any materials or entered into any engagements or made any advance on any account or with a view to the execution of the work or the performance of the contract.

## **CLAUSE 15**

## Suspension of Work

- i. The contractor shall, on receipt of the order in writing of the Engineer-in-Charge, (whose decision shall be final and binding on the contractor) suspend the progress of the works or any part thereof for such time and in such manner as the Engineer-in- Charge may consider necessary so as not to cause any damage or injury to the work already done or endanger the safety thereof for any of the following reasons:
  - a. on account of any default on the part of the contractoror;
  - b. for proper execution of the works or part thereof for reasons other than the default of the contractor; or
  - c. For safety of the works or partthereof.

The contractor shall, during such suspension, properly protect and secure the works to the extent necessary and carry out the instructions given in that behalf by the Engineer-in-Charge.



## ii. If the suspension is ordered for reasons (b) and (c) in sub-para (i) above (but not attributed tocontractor):

- a. the contractor shall be entitled to an extension of time equal to the period of every such suspension PLUS 25% for completion of the item or group of items of work for which a separate period of completion is specified in the contract and of which the suspended work forms a part, and;
- b. If the total period of all such suspensions in respect of an item or group of items or work for which a separate period of completion is specified in the contract exceeds thirty days, the contractor shall, in addition, be entitled to such compensation as the Engineer-in-Charge may consider reasonable in respect of salaries and/or wages paid by the contractor to his employees and labour at site, remaining idle during the period of suspension, adding thereto 2% to cover indirect expenses of the contractor provided the contractor submits his claim supported by details to the Engineer-in-Charge within fifteen days of the expiry of the period of 30days.
- c. If the works or part thereof is suspended on the orders of the Engineer-in-Charge for more than three months at a time, except when suspension is ordered for reasons (a) in sub-para (i) above, the contractor may after receipt of such order serve a written notice on the Engineer-in-Charge requiring permission within fifteen days from receipt by the Engineer-incharge of the said notice, to proceed with the work or part thereof in regard to which progress has been suspended and if such permission is not granted within that time, the contractor, if he intends to treat the suspension, where it affects only a part of the works as on omission of such part by AAI or where it affects whole of the works, as an abandonment of the works by AAI, shall within ten days of expiry of such period of 15 days give notice in writing of his intention to the Engineerin-Charge. In the event of the contractor treating the suspension as an abandonment of the contract by AAI, he shall have no claim to payment of any compensations on account of any profit or advantage which he might have derived from the execution of the work in full but which he could not derive in consequence of the abandonment. He shall, however, be entitled to such compensation, as the Engineer-in-Charge may consider reasonable, in respect of salaries and/or wages paid by him to his employees and labour at site, remaining idle in consequence adding to the total thereof 2% to cover indirect expenses of the contractor provided the contractor submits his claim supported by details to the Engineer-in-Charge within 30 days of the expiry of the period of 3 months.

## **CLAUSE 15 A**

The contractor shall not be entitled to claim any compensation from AAI for the losses suffered by him on account of delay by AAI in the supply of materials in Schedule 'B' where such delay is covered by the difficulties relating to supply of wagons, force majeure or any reasonable cause beyond the control of AAI.

This clause 15 A will not be applicable for works where no material is stipulated for issue by AAI.



Action in case Work not done as per Specifications All works under or in course of execution or executed in pursuance of the contract, shall at all times be open and accessible to the inspection and supervision of the Engineer-in-Charge, his authorize subordinates in charge of the work and all the superior officers, officer of the Quality Assurance Unit of the AAI or any organization engaged by the Department of Quality Assurance and of the Chief technical Examiner's Office, and the contractor shall, at all times, during the usual working hours and at all other times at which reasonable notice of the visit of such officers has been given to the contractor, either himself be present to receive orders and instructions or have a responsible agent duly accredited in writing, present for that purpose. Orders given to the Contractor's agent shall be considered to have the same force as if they had been given to the contractorhimself.

If it shall appear to the Engineer-in -charge or his authorized subordinates in charge of the work or to the Executive Director-In-charge of quality assurance or his subordinate officers or the officers of the organization engaged by the AAI for quality Assurance or to the Chief Technical Examiner or his subordinate officers, that any work has been executed with unsound, imperfect, or unskillful workmanship, or with materials or articles provided by him for the execution of the work which are unsound or of a quality inferior to that contracted or otherwise not in accordance with the contract, the contractor shall, on demand in writing which shall be made within twelve months (six months in the case of work costing Rs.10 lac and below except road work) of the completion of the work from the Engineer-in-Charge specifying the work, materials or articles complained of notwithstanding that the same may have been passed, certified and paid for forthwith rectify, or remove and reconstruct the work so specified in whole or in part, as the case may require or as the case may be, remove the materials or articles so specified and provide other proper and suitable materials or articles at his own charge and cost. In the event of the failing to do so within a period specified by the Engineer-in-Charge in his demand aforesaid, then the contractor shall be liable to pay compensation at the same rate as under clause 2 of the contract (for non-completion of the work in time) for this default.

In such case the Engineer-in-Charge may not accept the item of work at the rates applicable under the contract but may accept such items at reduced rates as the authority specified in schedule 'F' may considered reasonable during the preparation of on account bills or final bill if the item is so acceptable without detriment to the safety and utility of the item and the structure or he may reject the work outright without any payment and/or get it and other connected and incidental items rectified, or removed and re-executed at the risk and cost of the contractor. Decision of the Engineer-in-Charge to be conveyed in writingin respect of the same will be final and binding on the contractor.

## **CLAUSE17**

Contractor Liable for Damages, defects during maintenance period If the contractor or his working people or servants shall break, deface, injure or destroy any part of building in which they may be working, or any building, road, road kerb fence, enclosure, water pipe, cables, drains, electric or telephone post or wires, trees, grass or grassland, or cultivated ground contiguous to the premises on which the work or any part is being executed, or if any damage shall happen to the work while in progress, from any cause whatever or if any defect, shrinkage or other faults appear in the work within twelve months (six months in the case of work costing Rs. Ten lacs and below except road work) after a certificate final or otherwise of its completion shall have been given bythe



Engineer-in-charge as aforesaid arising out of defect or improper materials or workmanship the contractor shall upon receipt of a notice in writing on that behalf make the same good at his own expense or in default the Engineeringcharge cause the same to be made good by other workmen and deduct the expense from any sums that may be due or at any time thereafter may become due to the contractor, or from his security deposit or the proceeds of sale thereof or of a sufficient portion thereof. The security deposit of the contractor shall not be refunded before the expiry of twelve months (six months in the case of work costing Rs.Ten lacs and below except road work) after the issue of the certificate final or otherwise, of completion of work, or till the final bill has been prepared and passed whichever is later. Provided that in the case of road work, if in the opinion of the Engineer-in-charge, half of the security deposit is sufficient, to meet all liabilities of the contractor under this contract, half of the security deposit will be refundable after six months and the remaining half after twelve months of the issue of the said certificate of completion or till the final bill has been prepared and passed whichever islater.

In case of Maintenance and Operation works of E&M services, the security deposit deducted from contractors shall be refunded within one month from the date of final payment or within one month from the date of completion of the maintenance contract whichever is earlier.

## **CLAUSE 18**

Contractor
to Supply
Tools &
Plants etc

The contractor shall provide at his own cost all materials (except such special materials, if any, as may in accordance with the contract be supplied from the Engineer-in charge's stores) machinery, tools & plants as specified in Schedule F. in addition to this, appliances, implements, other plants, ladders, cordage, tackle, scaffolding and temporary works required for the proper execution of the work, whether original, altered or substituted and whether included in the specifications or other documents forming part of the contract or referred to in these conditions or not, or which may be necessary for the purpose of satisfying or complying with the requirements of the Engineer-in charge as to any matter as to which under these conditions he is entitled to be satisfied, or which he is entitled to require together with carriage therefor to and from the work. The contractor shall also supply without charge the requisite number of persons with the means and materials, necessary for the purpose of setting out works, and counting, weighing and assisting the measurement for examination at any time and from time to time of the work or materials. Failing his so doing, the same may be provided by the Engineer-in-charge at the expense of the contractor and the expenses may be deducted, from any money due to the contractor, under this contract or otherwise and/ or from his security deposit or the proceeds of sale thereof, or of asufficient portions thereof.

## **CLAUSE 18 A**

In every case in which by virtue of the provisions sub-section(i) of Section 12, of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1923, AAI is obliged to pay compensation to a workman employed by the contractor, in execution of the works, AAI will recover from the contractor, the amount of the compensation so paid, and, without prejudice to the rights of the AAI under sub-section(2) of Section 12, of the said act, AAI shall be at liberty to recover such amount or any part thereof by deducting it from the security deposit or from any sum due by AAI to the contractor whether under this contractor otherwise. AAI shall not be boundto

#### **CLAUSE 18 B**

## Ensuring Payment and Amenities to Workers if Contractor fails

In every case in which by virtue of the provisions of the Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) act 1970, and the Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Central Rules, 1971, AAI is obliged to pay any amounts of wages to a workman employed by the contractor in execution of the works, or to incur any expenditure in providing welfare and health amenities required to be provided under the above said Act and the rules under Clause 19H or under the AAI Contractor's Labour Regulations or under the Rules framed by AAI from time to time for the protection of health and sanitary arrangements for workers employed by AAI Contractors, AAI will recover from the contractor the amount of wages so paid or the amount of expenditure so incurred and without prejudice to the rights of the AAI under sub section (2) of Section 20, sub section (4) of Section 21, of the Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act, 1970, AAI shall be at liberty to recover such amount or any part thereof by deducting it from the security deposit or from any sum due by AAI to the contractor whether under this contract or otherwise AAI shall not be bound to contest any claim made against it under sub section (1) of Section 20, sub section (4) of Section 21, of the said Act, except on the written request of the contractor and upon his giving to the AAIfull security for all costs for which AAI might become liable in contesting suchclaim.

## **CLAUSE 19**

Labour

The contractor shall obtain a valid license under the contract labour (R&A) Act, 1970 and the Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Central Rules, 1971, before the commencement of the work, and continue to have a valid license until the completion of the work. The contractor shall also abide by the provisions of the Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act, 1986.

The contractor shall also comply with the provisions of the building and other construction workers (Regulation of Employment & Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 and the building and other Construction Workers Welfare Cess Act, 1996. Any failure to fulfill these requirements shall attract the penal provisions of this contract arising out of the resultant non execution of the work.

## **CLAUSE 19A**

The contractor(s) shall make arrangements for conservancy and sanitation in the labour camps according to the rules of the Local Public Health and Medical Authorities.

## **CLAUSE 19I**

The Engineer-in-Charge may require the contractor to dismiss or remove from the site of the work any person or persons in the contractors' employ upon the work who may be incompetent or misconduct himself and the contractor shall forthwith comply with such requirements. In respect of maintenance/repair or renovation works etc. where the labour have an easy access to the individual work premises, the contractor shall issue identity cards to the labourers, whether temporary or permanent and he shall be responsible for any untoward action on the part of such labour. Assistant Manager/Junior Executive will display a list of contractors working in the colony/Blocks on the notice board in the colonyand also at the service center, to apprise the residents about the same.

## **CLAUSE 19J**

It shall be the responsibility of the contractor to see that the building under construction is not occupied by anybody unauthorized during construction, and is handed over to the Engineer-in-Charge with vacant possession of complete building. If such building though completed is occupied illegally, then the Engineer-in-Charge shall have the option to refuse to accept the said building/buildings in that position. Any delay in acceptance on this account will be treated as the delay in completion and for such delay, a levy upto 5% of tendered value of work may be imposed by the General Manager Engg. Whose decision shall be final both with regard to the justification and quantum and be binding on the contractor. However, the Executive Director Engg., through a notice may require the contractor to remove the illegal occupation any time on or before construction and delivery.

respective trade, the contractor shall substitute such tradesmen within two days of written notice from Engineer –in- Charge. Failure on the part of contractor to
obtain approval of Engineer-in-Charge or failure to deploy qualified tradesmen will attract a compensation to be paid by contractor at the rate of Rs.100 per such tradesman per day. Decision of Engineer in Charge as to whether particular



If previous approval as aforesaid is not obtained, the contract shall be deemed to have been assigned in contravention of Clause21 hereof and the same action may be taken and the same consequences shall ensue as provided in the said Clause 21.

## Dispute Resolution Mechanism and Arbitration

Except where otherwise provided in the contract, all questions and disputes relating to the meaning of the specifications, design, drawings and instruction here-in before mentioned and as to the quality of workmanship or materials used on the work or as to any other question, claim, right, matter or thing whatsoever, in any way arising out of or relating to the contract, designs, drawings, specifications, estimates, instructions, orders or these conditions or otherwise concerning the work or the execution or failure to execute the same whether arising during the progress of the work or after the cancellation, termination, completion or abandonment thereof shall be dealt with as mentioned hereinafter:

i. If the contractor considers any work demanded of him to be outside the requirement of the contract, or disputes any drawing, record or decision given in writing by the Engineer-in-Charge or if the Engineer in Charge considers any act or decision of the contractor on any matter in connection with or arising out of the contract or carrying out of the work, to be unacceptable and is disputed such party shall promptly within 15 days of the arising of the disputes request the Executive Director (Engg.)/Regional Executive Director/Member (Plg) /Chairman, AAI as the case may be, who shall refer the dispute to Dispute Redressal Committee (DRC) within 15 days along with a list of disputes with amounts claimed if any, in respect of each such disputes. The Dispute Redressal Committee (DRC) shall give the opposing party two weeks for written response, and give its decision within a period of 60 days extendable by 30 days by consent of both the parties from the receipt of reference from the Executive Director (Engg.)/Regional Executive Director/Member (Plg) /Chairman, AAI. Provided that no party shall be represented before the Dispute Redressal Committee by an advocate / legal counseletc.

If the Dispute Redressal Committee (DRC) fails to give its decision within aforesaid period or any party is dis-satisfied with the decision of Dispute Redressal Committee (DRC) or expiry of time limit given above, then either party may within a period of 30 days from the receipt of the decision of Dispute Redressal Committee (DRC), give notice to the Executive Director (Engg.)/Regional Executive Director/Member (Plg) /Chairman, AAI as the case may be for appointment of Arbitrator on prescribed proforma as per Appendix-XVII.under intimation to the other party.

It is also a term of contract and each party invoking Arbitration must exhaust the aforesaid mechanism of settlement of claims/disputes prior to invoking Arbitration.

The Executive Director (Engg.)/Regional Executive Director/Member (Plg) /Chairman, AAI shall in such case appoint the sole arbitrator or one of the three arbitrators as the case may be within 30 days of receipt of such a request and refer such disputes to arbitration. Wherever the Arbitral Tribunal consists of three Arbitrators, the contractor shall appoint one arbitrator within 30 days of making request for arbitration or of receipt of request by Engineer in Charge to Executive Director (Engg.)/Regional Executive Director/Member (Plg) /Chairman, AAI for appointment of arbitrator, as the case may be, and two appointed arbitrators shall appoint the third arbitrator, who shall act as the presiding arbitrator. In the event of:

- a. A party fails to appoint the second arbitrator, or
- b. The two appointed arbitrators fail to appoint the PresidingArbitrator, then Member (Plg)/Chairman,AAI shall appoint the second or Presiding Arbitrator as the case may be.



iiDisputes or difference shall be referred for adjudication through arbitration by a Tribunal having Sole Arbitrator where tendered amount is Rs. 300.00 Cr or less. Where tendered value is more than Rs. 300.00 Cr., Tribunal shall consist of three arbitrators as above. The requirements of the arbitration and the conciliation act, 1996 (26 of 1996) and further modified Act in 2015 and any further statutory modifications or reenactment thereof and the rules made thereunder and for the time being in force shall beapplicable.

It is a term of this contract that the party invoking Arbitration shall give a list of disputes with amounts, claimed, if any, in respect of each such disputes along with the notice for appointment of Arbitrator and giving reference to the decision of the DRC.

It is also term of this contract that any member of Arbitration Tribunal shall be a graduate engineer with experience in handling public works, engineering contracts at a level not lower than Chief Engineer. This shall be treated as mandatory qualification to be appointed as Arbitrator.

Parties, before or at the time of appointment of Aarbitral Tribunal may agree in writing for fast track arbitration as per the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 (26 of 1996) as amended in 2015.

Subject to provision in the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 (26 of 1996) as amended in 2015 whereby the counter claims if any can be directly filed before the arbitrator without any requirement of reference by the Appointing Authority, the Arbitrator shall adjudicate on only such disputes as are referred to him by the appointing authority and give separate award against each disputes and claim referred to him and in all cases where the total amount of the claims by any party exceed Rs. 1,00,000/-, the Arbitrator shall give reasons for theaward.

It is also a term of the contract that if any fees are payable to the arbitrator, these shall be paid as per the Act. It is also a term of the contract that the arbitrator shall be deemed to have entered on the reference on the date he issues notice to both the parties calling them to submit their statement of claims and counter statement ofclaims.

The place of the arbitration shall be mentioned in schedule 'F'. In case there is no mention of place of arbitration, the Arbitral Tribunal shall determine the place of arbitration. The venue of the arbitration shall be such place as may be fixed by the Arbitral Tribunal in consultation with both the parties. Failing any such agreement, then the Arbitral Tribunal shall decide the venue.

## **CLAUSE 26**

Contractor to indemnify AAI against Patent Rights

The contractor shall fully indemnify and keep indemnified the Chairman AAI against any action, claim or proceeding relating to infringement or use of any patent or design or any alleged patent or design rights and shall pay and royalties which may be payable in respect of any article or part thereof included in the contract. In the event of any claims made under or action brought against AAI in respect of any such matters as aforesaid, the contractor shall be immediately notified thereof and the contractor shall be at liberty, at his own expense, to settle any dispute or to conduct any litigation that may arise there from, provided that the contractor shall not be liable to indemnify the AAI if the infringement of the patent or design or any alleged patent or design right is the direct result of an order passed by the Engineer-in-Charge in this behalf.

## **CLAUSE29**

With-holding
and lien in
respect of
sums due from
contractor

i. Whenever any claims for payment of a sum of money arises out of or under the contract or against the contractor, the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI shall be entitled to withhold and also have a lien to retain such sum or sums in whole or in part from the security, if any deposited by the contractor and for the purpose aforesaid, the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI shall be entitled to withhold the security deposit if any, furnished as the case may be and also have a lien over the same pending finalization or adjudication of any such claim. In the event of the security being insufficient to cover the claimed amount or amounts or if no security has been taken from the contractor, the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI shall be entitled to withhold and have lien to retain to the extent of such claimed amount or amounts referred to above from any sum or sums found payable or which may at any time thereafter become payable to the contractor under the same contract or any other contract with the Engineer-in Charge of the AAI or any contracting person through the Engineer-in-Charge pending finalization of adjudication of any suchclaim.

It is an agreed term of the contract that the sum of money or moneys so withheld or retained under the lien referred to above by the Engineer-in-Charge or AAI will be kept withheld or retained as such by the Engineer-in-Charge or AAI till the claim arising out of or under the contract is determined by the arbitrator. (if the contract is governed by the arbitration clause) or by the competent court, as the case may be and that the contractor will have no claim for interest or damages whatsoever on any account in respect of such withholding or retention under the lien referred to above and duly notified as such to the contractor. For the purpose of this clause, where the contractor is a partnership firm or a limited company, the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI shall be entitled to withhold and also have a lien to retain towards such claimedamountoramountsinwholeorinpartfromanysumfoundpayable toanypartner/limitedcompanyasthecasemaybe, whetherinhis individual



capacity or otherwise.

ii. AAI shall have the right to cause an audit and technical examination of the works and the final bills of the contractor including all supporting vouchers, abstract, etc,. to be made after payment of the final bill and if as a result of such audit and technical examination any sum is found to have been overpaid in respect of any work done by contractor under the contract or any work claimed to have been done by the him under the contract and found not to have been executed, the contractor shall be liable to refund the amount of over payment and it shall be lawful for AAI to recover the same from him in the manner prescribed in sub-clause (i) of this clause or in any other manner legally permissible; and if it is found that the contractor was paid less than what was due to him under the contract in respect of any work executed by him under it, the amount of such under payment shall be duly paid by AAI to the contractor, without any interest thereonwhatsoever.

Provided that the AAI shall not be entitled to recover any sum overpaid, nor the contractor shall be entitled to payment of any sum paid short where such payment has been agreed upon between the Executive Director Engineering / General Manager Engineering on the one hand and the contractor on the other under any term of the contract permitting payment for work after assessment by the Executive Director Engineering / General Manager Engineering.

## **CLAUSE 29 A**

Lien in respect
of claims in
other Contracts

- i. Any sum of money due and payable to the contractor (including the security deposit refundable to him) under the contract may be withheld or retained by way of lien by the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI or any other contracting person or persons through Engineer-in-Charge against any claim of the Engineer-in-Charge or AAI or such other person or persons in respect of payment of a sum of money arising out of or under any other contract made by the contractor with the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI or with such other person orpersons.
- ii. It is an agreed term of the contract that the sum of money so withheld or retained under this clause by the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI will be kept withheld or retained as such by the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI or till his claim arising out of the same contract or any other contract is either mutually settled or determined by the arbitration clause or by the competent court, as the case may be and that the contractor shall have no claim for interest or damages whatsoever on this account or on any other ground in respect of any sum of money withheld or retained under this clause and duly notified assuch to the contractor.

## **CLAUSE 30**

## Employment of coal mining or controlled area labour not permissible

- i. The contractor shall not employ coal mining or controlled area labour falling under any category whatsoever or in connection with the work or recruit labour from area within a radius of 32 km (20 miles) of the controlled area. Subject as above the contractor shall employ imported labour only i.e., deposit imported labour or labour imported by contractors from area, from which import ispermitted.
- ii. Where ceiling price for imported labour has been fixed by State or Regional Labour Committees not more than that ceiling price shall be paid to the labour by the contractor.
- iii. The contractors hall immediately remove any labourer who may be pointed



out by the Engineer-in-Charge as being a coal mining or controlled area labourer. Failure to do so shall render the contractor liable to pay to AAI a sum calculated at the rate of Rs.10/- per day per labourer. The certificate of the Engineer-in –Charge about the number of coal mining or controlled area labourer and the number of days for which they worked shall be final and binding upon all parties to this contract.

iv. It is declared and agreed between the parties that the aforesaid stipulation in this clause is one in which the public are interested within the meaning of the exception in Section 74 of Indian Contract Act, 1872.

## **Explanation:**

Controlled area mean the following areas:

Districts of Dhanbad, Hazaribagh, Jamtara- Sub-Division under SanthalParganaCommissionery, District of Bankuara, Birbhum, Burdwan, District of Bilaspur. Any other area which may be declared a Controlled Area by or with

the approval of the Central Government.

## **CLAUSE 31**

# Unfiltered water supply

The contractor(s) shall make his/their own arrangements for water required for the work and nothing extra will be paid for the same. This will be subject to the following conditions.

- i. That the water used by the contractor (s) shall be fit for construction purposes to the satisfaction of the Engineer-in-Charge.
- ii. The Engineer-in-Charge shall make alternative arrangements for supply of water at the risk and cost of contractor (s) if the arrangements made by the contractor(s)forprocurementofwaterareintheopinionoftheEngineer-in-Charge, unsatisfactory.

## **CLAUSE 31A**

# Departmental water supply, if available

Water if available may be supplied to the contractor by the department subject to the following conditions:-

- i. The water charges @1% shall be recovered on gross amount of the work done.
- ii. The contractor(s) shall make his/their own arrangement of water connection and laying of pipelines from existing main of source of supply.
- iii. The Department do not guarantee to maintain uninterrupted supply of water and it will be incumbent on the contractor (s) to make alternative arrangements for water at his/their own cost in the event of any temporary break down in the AAI's water main so that the progress of his/their work is not held up for want of water. No claim of damage or refund of watercharges will be entertained on account of such break down.

## **CLAUSE 32**

## Alternate water arrangements

i. Where there is no piped water supply arrangement and the water is taken by the contractor from the wells or hand pump constructed by the AAI, no charge shall be recovered from the contractor or that account. The contractor shall, however, draw water at such hours of the day that it does not interfere with the normal use for which the hand pumps and well are intended. He will also be responsible for all damage and abnormal repairs arising out of his use, thecostofwhichshallberecoverablefromhim.TheEngineer-in-Chargeshall be the final authority to determine the cost recoverable from the



contractor on this account and his decision shall be binding on the contractor.

ii. The contractor shall be allowed to construct temporary wells in AAI land for taking water for construction purposes only after he has got permission of the Engineer-in-Charge in writing. No charges shall be recovered from the contractor on this account but the contractor shall be required to provide necessary safety arrangements to avoid any accidents or damage to adjacent buildings, roads and service lines. He shall be responsible for any accidents or damage caused due to construction and subsequent maintenance of the wells and shall restore the ground to its original condition after the wells are dismantled on completion of the work.

## **CLAUSE33**

## Return of Surplus materials

Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in this contract, where any materials for the execution of the contract are procured with the assistance of AAI either by issue from AAI stocks or purchase made under orders or permits or licenses issued by AAI, the contractor shall hold the said materials economically and solely for the purpose of the contract and not dispose of them without the written permission of the AAI and return, if required by the engineer-in-Charge, all surplus or unserviceable materials that may be left with him after the completion of the contract or at its termination for any reason whatsoever on being paid or credited such prices as the Engineer-in-Charge shall determine having due regard to the condition of the materials. The price allowed to the contractor however shall not exceed the amount charged to him excluding the element of storage charges. The decision of the Engineer-in-Charge shall be final and conclusive. In the event of breach of the aforesaid condition, the contractor shall in addition to throwing himself open to action for contravention of the terms ofthelicenseorpermitand/orforcriminalbreachoftrust,beliabletoAAIfor all moneys, advantages or profits resulting or which in the usual course would have resulted to him by reason of such breach.

## **CLAUSE34**

## Hire of plant & Machinery

- i. The Contractor shall arrange at his own expense all tools, plant, machinery and equipment(hereinafter referred to as T&P) required for execution of the work except for the Plant & Machinery listed in Schedule 'C' and stipulated for issue to the contractor. If the contractor requires any item of T&P on hire from the T&P available with the AAI over and above the T&P stipulated for issue, the AAI will, if such item is available, hire it to the contractor at rates to be agreed upon between him and the Engineer-in-charge. In such a case, all the conditions hereunder for issue of T & P shall also be applicable to such T&P as is agreed to beissued.
- ii. Plant & Machinery when supplied on hire charges shown in Schedule 'C' shall be made over and taken back at the departmental equipment yard / shed shown in Schedule 'C' and the contractor shall bear the cost of carriage from the place of issue to the site of work and back. The contractor shall be responsible to return the plant and machinery with condition in which it was handed over to him, and he shall be responsible for all damage caused to the said plant and machinery at the site of work or elsewhere in operation and otherwise during transit including damage to or loss of plant and for all losses due to his failure to return the same soon after the completion of the work for which it was issued. The Engineer-in-charge shall be the sole judge to determine the liability of the contractor and its extent in this regard and his decision shall be final and binding on thecontractor.



- iii. The plant and machinery as stipulated above will be issued as and when available and if required by the contractor. The contractor shall arrange his programme of work according to the availability of the plant and machinery and no claim, whatsoever, will be entertained from him for any delay in supply by thedepartment.
- iv. The hire charges shall be recovered at the prescribed rates from and inclusive of the date the plant and machinery made over upto and inclusive of the date of the return in good order even though the same may not have been working for any cause except major breakdown due to no fault of the contractor or faulty use requiring more than three working days continuously (excluding intervening holidays and Sundays) for bringing the plant in order. The contractor shall immediately intimate in writing to the Engineer-in-charge when any plant or machinery gets out of order requiring major repairs as aforesaid. The Engineer-in- charge shall record the date and time of receipt of such intimation in the log sheet of the plant or machinery. Based on this if the breakdown before lunch period or major breakdown will be computed considering half a day's breakdown on the day of complaint. If the breakdown occurs in the post lunch period of major breakdown will be computed starting from the next working day. In case of any dispute under this clause, the decision of the Executive Director (Engg) /General Manager (Engg) shall be final and binding on the contractor.
- v. The hire charges shown above are for each day of 8 hours (inclusive of the one hour lunch break) or partthereof.
- vi. Hire charges will include service of operating staff as required and also supply of lubricating oil and stores for cleaning purposes. Power fuel of approved type, firewood, kerosene oil etc. for running the plant and machinery and also the full time chowkidar for guarding the plant and machinery against any loss or damage shall be arranged by the contractor who shall be fully responsible for the safeguard and security of plant and machinery. The contractor shall on or before the supply of plant and machinery sign an agreement indemnifying the Department against any loss or damage caused to the plant and machinery either during transit or at site ofwork.
- vii. Ordinarily, no plant and machinery shall work for more than 8 hours a day inclusive of one hour lunch break. In case of an urgent work however, the Engineer-incharge may, at his discretion, allow the plant and machinery to be worked for more than normal period of 8 hours a day. In that case, the hourly hire charges for overtime to be borne by the contractor shall be 50% more than the normal proportionate hourly charges (1/8th of the daily charges) subject to a minimum of half day's normal charges on any particular day. For working out hire charges for over time, a period of half an hour and above will be charged as one hour and a period of less than half an hour will be ignored.
- viii. The contractor shall release the plant and machinery every seventh day for periodical servicing and / or wash out which may take about three to four hours or more. Hire charges for full day shall be recovered from the contractor for the day of servicing / wash out irrespective of the period employed inservicing.
- ix. The plant and machinery once issued to the contractor shall not be returned by him on account of lack of arrangements of labour and materials, etc. on his part, the same will be returned only when they are required for major repairs or when in the opinion of the Engineer-in-charge, the work or a portion of work for which the same was issued iscompleted.
- x. LogBookforrecordingthehoursofdailyworkforeachoftheplantand machinery supplied to the contractor will be maintained by the Department and will be countersigned by the contractor or his authorised agent daily. In



- case the contractor contests the correctness of the entries and / or fails to sign the Log Book, the decision of the Engineer-in-charge shall be final and binding on him. Hire charges will be calculated according to the entries in the Log Book and will be binding on the contractor. Recovery on account of hire charges for road rollers shall be made for the minimum number of days worked out on the assumption that a roller can consolidate per day and maximum quantity of materials or area surfacing as noted against each in the annexed statement (see attached annexure).
- xi. In the case of concrete mixers, the contractors shall arrange to get the hopper cleaned and the drum washed at the close of the work each day or each occasion. (a) In case rollers for consolidation are employed by the contractor himself, log book for such rollers shall be maintained in the same manner as is done in case of departmental rollers, maximum quantity of any items to be consolidated for each roller-day shall also be same as in Annexure to Clause 34(x). For less use of rollers, recovery for the less roller days shall be made at the stipulated issuerate.
- xii. The contractor shall be responsible to return the plant and machinery in the condition in which it was handed over to him and he shall be responsible for all damage caused to the said plant and machinery at the site of work or elsewhere in operation or otherwise or during transit including damage to or loss of parts, and for all losses due to his failure to return the same soon after the completion of the work for which it was issued. The Engineer-in-charge shall be the sole judge to determine the liability of the contractor and its extent in this regard and his decision shall be final and binding on the contractor.
- xiii. The contractor will be exempted from levy of any hire charges for the number of days he is called upon in writing by the Engineer-in-charge to suspend execution of the work, provided AAI's plant and machinery in question have, in fact, remained idle with the contractor because of the suspension.
- xiv. In the event of the contractor not requiring any item of plant and machinery issued by AAI though not stipulated for issue in Schedule 'C' any time after taking delivery at the place of issue, he may return it after two days written notice or at any time without notice if he agrees to pay hire charges for two additional days without, in any way, affecting the right of the Engineer-in-chargetousethesaidplantandmachineryduringthesaidperiodoftwo days as he likes including hiring out to a third party.

## Condition relating to use of asphaltic materials

- i. The contractor undertakes to make arrangement for the supervision of the work by the firm supplying the tar or bitumenused.
- the contractor shall collect the total quantity of tar or bitumen required for the work as per standard formula, before the process of painting is started and shall hypothecate it to the Engineer-in-Charge. If any bitumen or tar remains unused on completion of the work on account of lesser use of materials in actual execution of for reasons other than authorised changes of specifications and abandonment of portion of work, a corresponding deduction equivalent to the cost of unused materials as determined by the Engineer-in-Charge shall be made and the material return to the contractors. Although the materials are hypothecated to AAI, the contractor undertakes the responsibility for their proper watch, safe custody and protection against all risks. The materials shall not be removed from site of work without the consent of the Engineer-in-Charge inwriting.



	iii. The contractor shall be responsible for rectifying defects noticed within a

# **Employment of Technical Staff and employees**

Contractors Superintendence, Supervision, Technical staff & Employees

i. The contractor shall provide all necessary superintendence during execution of the work and all along thereafter as may be necessary for proper fulfilling of the obligations under the contract.

The Contractor shall immediately after receiving letter of acceptance of the tender and before commencement of the work, intimate in writing to the Engineer-in-Charge, the name (s), qualifications experience, age, address (s) and other particulars along with certificates, of the principal technical representative to be charge of the work and other technical representative (s) who will be supervising the work. Minimum requirement of such technical representative (s) and their qualifications and experience shall not be lower than specified in schedule 'F". The Engineer-in-Charge shall within 3 days of receipt of such communication intimate in writing his approval or otherwise of such a representative (s) to the contractor. Any such approval may at any time be withdrawn and in case of such withdrawal, the contractor shall appoint another such representative (s) according to the provisions of this clause. Decision of the tender accepting authority shall be final and binding on the contractor in this respect. Such a principal technical representative and other technical representative (s) shall be appointed by the contractor soon after receipt of the approval from Engineer-in-charge and shall be available at site before start ofwork.

All the provisions applicable to the principal technical representative under the clause will also be applicable to other technical representative(s). The principal technical representative and other technical representative (s) shall be present at the site of work for supervision at all times when any construction activity is in progress and also present himself/themselves, as required to the Engineer-in-Charge and / or his designated representative to take instructions. Instructions given to the principal technical representative or other technical representative (s) shall be deemed to have the same force as if these have been given to the contractor. The Principal Technical Representative and other technical representatives shall be actually available atsitefullyduringallstagesofexecutionwork,duringrecording/checking

/ test checking of measurements of works whenever so required by the Engineer-in-Charge and shall also note down instructions conveyed by the Engineer-in-Charge or his designated representative (s) in the site order book and shall affix his/their signature in token of noting down the instructions and in token of acceptance of measurements / checked measurements / test checked measurements. The representative (s) shall not look after any other work. Substitutes, duly approved by engineer – in-Charge of the work in similar manner as aforesaid shall be provided in event of absence of any of the representative (s) by more than two days. If the Engineer-in-Charge, whose decision in this respect is final and binding on the contractor, is convinced that no such technical representative (s) is/are effectively appointed or is/are effectively attending or fulfilling the provision ofthis clause, a recovery (non-refundable) shall be effected from the contractoras



specified in Schedule 'F' and the decision of the Engineer–in- Charge as recorded in the site order book and measurement recorded checked/test checked in Measurement Books shall be final and binding on the contractor. Further if the contractor fails to appoint suitable technical Principal technical representative and / or other technical representative (s) and if such appointed persons are not effectively present or are absent by more than two days without duly approved substitute or do not discharge their responsibility satisfactorily, the Engineer–in–Charge shall have full powers to suspend the execution of the work until such date as suitable other technical representative (s) is / are appointed and the contractor shall be held responsible for the delay so caused to the work. The contractor shall submit a certificate of employment of the technical representative (s) (in the form of copy of Form- 16 or CPF deduction issued to the Engineer employed by him) alongwith every running account bill / final bill and shall produce evidence if at any times so required by the Engineer–in–Charge.

- ii. The contractor shall provide and employ on the site only such technical assistants as are skilled, and experienced in their respective fields and such foremen and supervisory staff as are competent to give proper supervision to the work. The contractor shall provide and employ skilled, semi-skilled and unskilled labour as is necessary for proper and timely execution of the work. The Engineer-in-Charge shall be at liberty to object to and require the contractor to remove from the works any person who in his opinion misconducts himself, or is incompetent or negligent in the performance of his duties or whose employment is otherwise considered by the Engineer-in Charge to be undesirable. Such person shall not be employed again at works site without the written permission of the Engineer-in-Charge and the persons so removed shall be replaced as soon as possible by competent substitutes.
- iii. The contractor shall not change his engineer/supervisory staff after approval of the Engineer-In-Charge. If Contractor wants to replace any of his staff due to unavoidable circumstances, he will seek permission of Engineer-In-Chargeindicatingreasonsforsuchchange,qualificationandexperienceof the alternative employee suggested by him. The qualification and experience of the alternative staff shall not be inferior to the person employed earlier.

#### **CLAUSE 37**

# Levy/Taxes/ Royalty/ Land License fee payable by Contractor

#### 1. Taxes:

- a. Rates to be quoted by the parties should be inclusive of all taxes, duties, CESS, fee, royalty charges etc. levied under any statute but exclusive of GST for all the items
- b. However GST, as applicable, shall be paid to the contractor, for any taxable supply / services / constructionrendered by the agency to AAI, against a valid GST invoice as per terms and conditions of the contract.
- c. In case supplies /services / works involve imports; the same should be identified separately. Basic Custom Duty & IGST will be paid directly by AAI by utilizing EPCG license / Duty Credit Scrip under Service Export from India Scheme (SEIS) of Govt. of India.



#### 2. Royalty:

- a. The contractor shall at his own expense, provide all materials required for the works other than those which are to be supplied by AAI. The contractor shall deposit royalty and obtain necessary permit for collection of stone, sand, red bajri, kankar etc. from the local authority in the matter and will abide by the notification issued by Central Govt. / State Government / Local State Authorities as applicable from time to time in this regard. The contractor is also bound to allow deduction from his bills any difference in statutory taxes/royalty and penalty proposed by Local State Authorities to AAI till finalization of settlement of all demands in this regard by Central / StateGovt.
- b. This will also be applicable to forestproduce.
- c. If pursuant to or under any law, notification or order any royalty, cess or the like becomes payable by the AAI and does not any time become payable by the contractor to the State Government. Local authorities in respect of any material used by the contractor in the works then in such a case, it shall be lawful to the AAI and it will have the right and be entitled to recover the amount paid in the circumstances as aforesaid from dues of the contractor.

#### 3. License fee forland

- a. The contractor shall be liable to pay license fee for the land allotted by AAI for installation of plants, labour camp, cementgodown and site office at AAI prevailing rates of license fee for unpaved land at the time of call oftender.
- b. In addition a security deposit at the rate of Rs 500/- per sqm in the form of DD/BG shall also be deposited by the contractor. In case contractor do not deposit security deposit same shall be deducted from 1st Running AccountBill.
- c. Such security deposit shall be released only after allotted land has been fully vacated by the contractor to entire satisfaction of Engineer-in-Charge.

#### **CLAUSE 38**

Conditions for

1. Rates to be quoted by the parties should be inclusive of all taxes, duties, CESS, fee, royalty charges etc. levied under any statute applicable on last stipulated date of receipt of tender including extension if any but exclusive of GST. No adjustment i.e. increase or decrease shall be made for any variation in the rate of GSI Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Cess or any tax, levy or Cess applicable on inputs.

However, effect of variation, as per Govt. order after the last date of receipt of tender including extension if any, in rates of GST or Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Cess or imposition or repeal of any other tax, levy or Cess applicable on output of the works contract shall be adjusted on either side, increase or decrease.

Provided further that for Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Cess or any tax (other than GST), levy or Cess varied or imposed after the last date of receipt of tender including extension if any, any increase shall be reimbursed to the contractor only if the contractor necessarily and properly pays such increased amount of taxes / levies / Cess.

Provided further that such increase in tax / levy / Cess including GST shall not reimbursed if made in the extended period of contract for which the contractor

This contract is liable to be cancelled if either the contractor or any of his employees is found at any time to be such a person who had not obtained the permission of AAI as aforesaid, before submission of the tender or engagement in the contractor's service, as the case

# Integrity Pact and Independent External Monitor.

Signing of Integrity Pact (As per Appendix XVIII) is mandatory for every bidder/contractor if provided so in Schedule F.

All tenderers shall have to submit an undertaking as per Appendix XVIII along with tender documents. AAI shall appoint Independent External Monitor(s) to oversee effective implementation of Integrity Pact for such works/supplies. For this purpose, a panel of Independent External Monitors shall be constituted by the Authority in concurrence with Central Vigilance Commission (CVC).

- i. The Contractor/Supplier shall have to act in accordance with the conditions laid down in the integritypact.
  - a. Signing of Integrity Pact is mandatory for every Bidder/Contractor in this procurement/bid process the signed original pact to be send to the office of Bid Manager and should reach before the due date mentioned inNIT.
  - b. The Bidder/contractor shall commit itself to ensure taking all measures necessary to prevent corrupt practices, unfair means and illegal activities during any stage of its bid or during any pre-contract or post-contract stage as specified in section 3 of the integritypact.
  - c. Any breach of the aforesaid provisions by the Bidder or any one employed by it or acting on its behalf (whether with or without the knowledge of the Bidder) shall entitle the authority to take all or any one of the action as specified in section 6 of the integritypact.
- ii. In case any violation of above conduct is established, AAI reserves right to take following actions.
  - a. If contractor commits a violation of its commitments and obligations under the Integrity Pact Program during bidding process, he shall be liable for disqualification from tender process and forfeiture of his Earnest Money Deposit/ BidSecurity.
  - b. In case of violation of the Integrity Pact after award of the contract, Authority is entitled to terminate the contract and shall be entitled to demand and recover from the contractor damages equivalent to 5% of the contract value or the amount equivalent to Security Deposit or Performance Bank Guarantee, whichever ishigher.
  - c. Authority may initiate appropriate proceedings against the contractor.
  - d. Contractor will be liable to pay damages as determined by the Authority.
  - e. Contractor against whom an action for violation of its commitments and obligations has been taken earlier again commits a violation, the Authority is entitled to debar such contractor for future tender/contract processes for a period as deemedfit.
  - f. A violation is considered to have occurred if the Authority is fully satisfied with the available documents and evidence submitted alongwith Independent External Monitor's recommendations /suggestions that no reasonable doubt exist in the matter.
  - iii. Person signing IP shall not approach the Courts while representing the matters to IEMs and he / she will await their decision in the matter.



Return of material and recovery for excess material issued.

- i. After completion of the work and also at any intermediate stage in the event of non-reconciliation of materials issued, consumed and in balance (see Clause 10), Theoretical quantity of materials issued by the AAI for use in the work shall be calculated on the basis and method givenhereunder;
  - a. Quantity of cement & bitumen shall be calculated on the basis of quantity of cement & bitumen required for different items of work as shown in the Schedule of Rates mentioned in Schedule 'F'. In case any item is executed for which standard co-efficient for the consumption of cement or bitumen are not available in the above mentioned schedule / statement or cannot be derived from the same shall be calculated on the basis of standard formula to be laid down by the Engineer-in-Charge.
  - b. Theoretical quantity of steel reinforcement or structural steel sections shall be taken as the quantity required as per design or as authorised by Engineer-in- Charge, including authorisedlappages, chairs etc. plus 3% wastage due to cutting into pieces, such theoretical quantity being determined and compared with the actual issues each diameter-wise, section wise and category wiseseparately.
  - c. Theoretical quantity of G.I. & C.I. or other pipes, conduits, wires and cables pig lead and G.I. / M.S. sheets shall be taken as quantity actually required and measures plus 5% for wastage due to cutting into pieces (except in the case of G.I./M.S. sheets it shall be 10%), such determination & comparison being made diameter-wise &category-wise.
  - d. For any other material as per actualrequirements.
- ii. Over the theoretical quantities of materials so computed a variation shall be allowed as specified in Schedule 'F'. The difference in the net quantities of material actually issued to the contractor and the theoretical quantities including such authorised variation, if not returned by the contractor or if not fully reconciled to the satisfaction of the Engineer-in-Charge within fifteen days of the issue of written notice by the Engineer-in-Charge to this effect shall be recovered at the rates specified in Schedule 'F', without prejudice to the provision of the relevant conditions regarding return of materials governing the contract. Decision of Engineer-in-Charge in regard to theoretical quantities of materials, which should have been actually used as per the Annexure of the standard schedule of rates and recovery at rates specified in Schedule 'F' shall be final and binding on the contractor. For non scheduled items, the decision of the Engineer – in - charge regarding theoretical quantities of materials which should have been actually used, shall be final and binding on the contractor.
- g. The said action under this clause is without prejudice to the right of the AAI to take action against the contractor under any other conditions of contract for not doing the work according to the prescribed specifications.
- h. For materials brought by the contractor for use in item of work at site, similar theoretical consumption shall be prepared and submitted to the Engineer-in-Charge for verification. If it is found that material consumed in the work is less than the theoretical consumption after taking into account permissible minus variation, the recovery for corresponding material shallbe effected as per rates specified in schedule 'F' under Clause 42.



# Compensation during warlike situations / act of terrorism

The work (whether fully constructed or not) and all materials, machines, tools and plants scaffolding, temporary buildings and other things connected therewith shall be at the risk of the contractor until the work has been delivered to the Engineer-in-Charge and a certificate from him to that effect obtained. In the event of the work or any materials properly brought to the site for incorporation in the work being damaged or destroyed in consequence of hostilities or warlike operation or act of terrorism, the contractor shall when ordered (in writing) by the Engineer-in-Charge to remove any debris from the site, collect and properly stack or remove in store all serviceable materials salvaged from the damaged work and shall be paid at the contract rates in accordance with the provision of this agreement for the work of clearing the site of debris, stacking or removal of serviceable material and for reconstruction of all works ordered by the Engineer-in-Charge, such payments being in addition to compensation upto the value of the work original executed before being damaged or destroyed and not paidfor.

In case of works damaged or destroyed but not already measured and paid for, the compensation shall be assessed by the Engineer-in charge upto Rs.5,000/- and by the Executive Director Engg. concerned for a higher amount. The contractor shall be paid for the damages / destruction suffered and for restoring the material at the rate based on analysis of rates tendered for in accordance with the provision of the contract. The certificate of the Engineer-in- Charge regarding the quality and quantity of materials and the purpose for which they were collected shall be final and binding on all parties to this contract.

Provided always that no compensation shall be payable for any loss in consequence of hostilities or warlike operation (a) unless the contractor had taken all such precautions against air raid as are deemed necessary by the A.R.P. Officers or the Engineer-in- Charge (b) for any material etc. not on the site of the work or for any tools plant, machinery, scaffolding, temporary building and other things not intended for the work.

In the event of the contractor having to carry out reconstruction as aforesaid, he shall be allowed such extension of time for its completion as is considered reasonable by the Engineer – in - charge.

#### **CLAUSE44**

Apprentices
Act provisions
to be complied
with

The contractor shall comply with the provisions of the Apprentices Act, 1961 and the rules and orders issued thereunder from time to time. If he fails to do so, his failure will be a breach of the contract and the Executive Director Engg. / General Manager (Engg.) may, in his discretion, cancel the contract. The contractor shall also be liable for any pecuniary liability arising on account of any violation by him of the provisions of the said Act.

#### CLAUSE45

# Release of security deposit after labour clearance

Security Deposit of the work shall not be refunded till the contractor produces a clearance certificate from the Labour Officer. As soon as the work is virtually complete the contractor shall apply for the clearance certificate to the Labour Officer under intimation to the Engineer-in-Charge. The Engineer-in-Charge, on receipt of the said communication, shall write to the Labour Officer to intimate if any complaint is pending against the contractor in respect of the work. If no complaint is pending, on record till after 3 months after completion of the work and / or no communication is received from the Labour Officer to this effect till six months after the date of completion, it will be deemed to have received the clearance certificate and the Security Deposit will be released if otherwise due.

# **SAFETY CODE**

- 1. Suitable Scaffolds should be provided for workmen for all works that cannot safely be done from the ground, or from solid construction except such short period work as can be done safely from ladders. When a ladder is used, an extra mazdoor shall be engaged for holding the ladder and if the ladder is used for carrying materials as well suitable footholds and hand-hold shall be provided on the ladder and the ladder shall be given an inclination not steeper than ½ to 1 (½ horizontal and 1vertical).
- 2. Scaffolding of staging more than 3.6m (12ft.) above the ground or floor, swung or suspended from an overhead support or erected with stationary support shall have a guard rail properly attached or bolted, braced and otherwise secured at least 90 cm. (3ft.) high above the floor or platform of such scaffolding on staging and extending along the entire length of the outside and ends thereof with only such opening as may be necessary for the delivery of materials. Such scaffolding or staging shall be so fastened as to prevent it from swaying from the building orstructure.
- 3. Working platforms, gangways and stairways should be so constructed that they should not sag unduly or unequally, and if the height of the platform or the gangway or the stairway is more than 3.6 m (12ft.) above ground level or floor level, they should be closely boarded, should have adequate width and should be suitably fastened as described in (2)above.
- 4. Every opening in the floor of a building or in a working platform shall be provided with suitable means to prevent the fall of person or materials by providing suitable fencing or railing whose minimum height shall be 90cm.(3ft.)
- 5. Safe means of access shall be provided to all working platforms and other working places. Every ladder shall be securely fixed. No portable single ladder shall be over 9m. (30ft.) in length while the width between side rails in rung ladder shall in no case be less than 29 cm. (11 ½ ") for ladder upto and including 3m. (10ft.) in length. For long ladders, this width should be increased at least ¼" for each additional 30cm. (1 foot) of length. Uniform step spacing of not more than 30cm shall be kept. Adequate precautions shall be taken to prevent danger from electrical equipment. No materials on any of the site or work shall be so stacked or placed as to cause danger or inconvenience to any person or the public. The contractor shall provide all necessary fencing and lights to protect the public from accident and shall be bound to bear the expenses of defence of every suit, action or other proceedings at law that may be brought by any person for injury sustained owing to neglect of the above precautions and to pay any damages and cost which may be awarded in any such suit, action or proceedings to any such person on which may, with the consent of the contractor, be paid to compensate any claim by any suchperson.
- 6. a. Excavation and Trenching All trenches 1.2 m. (4ft.) or more in depth, shall at all times be supplied with at least one ladder for each 30m. (100ft.) in length or fraction thereof, Ladder shall extend from bottom of the Trench to at least 90cm (3fts) above the surface of the ground. The side of the trenches which are 1.5 m. (5 ft.) or more in depth shall be stepped back to give suitable slope or securely held by timber bracing, so as to avoid the danger of sides collapsing. The excavated material shall not be placed within 1.5 m. (5 ft.) of the edges of the trench or half of the depth of the trench whichever is more. Cutting shall be done from top to bottom. Under no circumstances, undermining or undercutting shall bedone.



#### b. Safety Measures for digging bore holes:-

- i. If the bore well is successful, it should be safely capped to avoid caving and collapse of the bore well. The failed and the abandoned ones should be completely refilled to avoid caving and collapse;
- ii. During drilling, Sign boards should be erected near the site with the address of the drilling contractor and the Engineer-in-charge of thework;
- iii. Suitable fencing should be erected around the well during the drilling and after the installation of the rig on the point of drilling, flags shall be put 50 Mtr all around the point of drilling to avoid entry ofpeople/animals;
- iv. After drilling the bore well, a cement platform (0.50 Mtr x 0.50 Mtr x 1.20 Mtr) 0.60 Mtr above ground level and 0.60 Mtr below ground level should be constructed around the wellcasing;
- v. After the completion of the bore well, the contractor should cap the bore well properly by welding steel plate, cover the bore well with the drilled wet soil and fix thorny shrubs over the soil. This should be done even while repairing thepump;
- vi. After the bore well is drilled the entire site should be brought to the groundlevel;
- 7. Demolition Before any demolition work is commenced and also during the progress of the work.
  - i) All roads and open areas adjacent to the work site shall either be closed or suitably protected.
  - ii) No electric cable or apparatus which is liable to be a source of danger or a cable or apparatus used by the operator shall remain electrically charged.
  - iii) All practical steps shall be taken to prevent danger to persons employed from risk of fire or explosion or flooding. No floor, roof or other part of the building shall be so overloaded with debris or materials as to render itunsafe.
- 8. All necessary personal safety equipment as considered adequate by the Engineer-in-Charge should be kept available for the use of the person employed on the site and maintained in a condition suitable for immediate use, and the contractor should take adequate steps to ensure proper use of equipment by those concerned. The following safety equipment shall invariably be provided.
  - i) Workers employed on mixing asphaltic materials, cement and lime mortars shall be provided with protective footwear and protectivegoggles.
  - ii) Those engaged in white washing and mixing or stacking of cement bags or any material which is injurious to the eyes shall be provided with protectivegoggles.
  - iii) Those engaged in welding works shall be provided with welder's protective eye-shields.
  - iv) Stone breaker shall be provided with protective goggles and protective clothing and seated at sufficiently safeintervals.
  - v) When workers are employed in sewers and manholes, which are in active use, the contractors shall ensure that the manhole covers are opened and ventilated at least for an hour before the workers are allowed to get into the manholes, and the manholes so opened shall be cordoned off with suitable railing and provided with warning signals or boards to prevent accident to the public. In addition, the contractor shall ensure that the following safety measures are adhered to:-
  - a) Entry for workers into the line shall not be allowed except under supervision of the Sr.Superintendent (Engg.) or any other higherofficer.
  - b) At least 5 to 6 manholes upstream and downstream should be kept open for at least 2 to 3 hours before any man is allowed to enter into the manhole for workinginside.
  - c) Before entry, presence of toxic gases should be tested by inserting wet lead acetate paper which changes colour in the presence of such gases and gives indication of their presence.



- d) Presence of Oxygen should be verified by lowering a detector lamp into the manhole. In case, no Oxygen is found inside the sewer line, workers should be sent only with oxygen bit
- e) Safety belt with rope should be provided to the workers. While working inside the manholes, such rope should be handled by two men standing outside to enable him to be pulled out duringemergency.
- f) The area should be barricaded or condoned off by suitable means to avoid mishaps of any kind. Proper warning signs should be displayed for the safety of the public whenever cleaning works are undertaken during night orday.
- g) No smoking or open flames shall be allowed near the blocked manhole beingcleaned.
- h) The malba obtained on account of cleaning of blocked manholes and sewer lines should be immediately removed to avoid accidents on account of slippery nature of themalba.
- i) Workers should not be allowed to work inside the manhole continuously. He should be given rest intermittently. The Engineer-in-Charge may decide the time upto which a worker may be allowed to work continuously inside themanhole.
- j) Gas masks with Oxygen Cylinder should be kept at site for use inemergency.
- k) Air-blowers should be used for flow of fresh air through the manholes. Whenever called for, portable air blowers are recommended for ventilating the manholes. The Motors for these shall be vapour proof and of totally enclosed type. Non sparking gas engines also could be used but they should be placed at least 2 meters away from the opening and on the leeward side protected from wind so that they will not be a source of friction on any inflammable gas that might bepresent.
- l) The workers engaged for cleaning the manholes / sewers should be properly trained before allowing to work in themanhole.
- m) The workers shall be provided with Gumboots or non-sparking shoes bump helmets and gloves non sparking tools safety lights and gas masks and portable air blowers (when necessary). They must be supplied with barrier cream for anointing the limbs before working inside the sewerlines.
- n) Workmen descending a manhole shall try each ladder stop or rung carefully before putting his full weight on it to guard against insecure fastening due to corrosion of the rung fixed to manholewell.
- o) If a man has received a physical injury, he should be brought out of the sewer immediately and adequate medical aid should be provided tohim.
- p) The extent to which these precautions are to be taken depend on individual situation but the decision of the Engineer-in-Charge regarding the steps to be taken in this regard in an individual case will befinal.
- (vi) The Contractor shall not employ men and women below the age of 18 years on the work of painting with products containing lead in any form. Wherever men above the age of 18 are employed on the work of lead painting, the following precaution should be taken:-
- a) No paint containing lead or lead products shall be used except in the form of paste or readymadepaint.
- b) Suitable face masks should be supplied for use by the workers when paint is applied in the form of spray or a surface having lead paint is dry rubbed andscrapped.
- c) Overall shall be supplied by the contractors to the workmen and adequate facilities shall be provided to enable the working painters to wash during and on the cessation ofwork.
- 9. An additional clause (viii)(i) of AAI Safety Code (iv) the Contractor shall not employ women and men below the age of 18 on the work of painting with product containing lead in any form, wherever men above the age of 18 are employed on the work of lead painting, the following principles must be observed for suchuse:
  - i) White lead, sulphate of lead or product containing these pigment, shall not be used in painting operation except in the form of pastes or paint ready foruse.
  - ii) Measures shall be taken, wherever required in order to prevent danger arising from the application of a paint in the form ofspray.



- iii) Measures shall be taken, wherever practicable, to prevent danger arising out of from dust caused by dry rubbing down andscraping.
- iv) Adequate facilities shall be provided to enable working painters to wash during and on cessation ofwork.
- v) Overall shall be worn by working painters during the whole of workingperiod.
- vi) Suitable arrangement shall be made to prevent clothing put off during working hours being spoiled by paintingmaterials.
- vii) Cases of lead poisoning and suspected lead poisoning shall be notified and shall be subsequently verified by medical man appointed by competent authority of AAI.
- viii) AAI may require, when necessary medical examination ofworkers.
- ix) Instructions with regard to special hygienic precautions to be taken in the painting trade shall be distributed to workingpainters.
- 10. When the work is done near any place where there is risk of drowning, all necessary equipments should be provided and kept ready for use and all necessary steps taken for prompt rescue of any person in danger and adequate provision, should be made for prompt first aid treatment of all injuries likely to be obtained during the course of thework.
- 11. Use of hoisting machines and tackle including their attachments, anchorage and supports shall conform to the following standards or conditions:
  - i) (a) These shall be of good mechanical construction, sound materials and adequate strength and free from patent defects and shall be kept repaired and in good working order
    - (b) Every rope used in hoisting or lowering materials or as a means of suspension shall be of durable quality and adequate strength, and free from patent defects.
  - ii) Every crane driver or hoisting appliance operator shall be properly qualified and no person under the age of 21 years should be in charge of any hoisting machine including any scaffolding winch or give signals tooperator.
  - iii) In case of every hoisting machine and of every chain ring hook, shackle swivel and pulley block used in hoisting or as means of suspension, the safe working load shall be ascertained by adequate means. Every hoisting machine and all gear referred to above shall be plainly marked with the safe working load. In case of a hoisting machine having a variable safe working load each safe working load and the condition under which it is applicable shall be clearly indicated. No part of any machine or any gear referred to above in this paragraph shall be loaded beyond the safe working load except for the purpose of testing.
  - iv) In case of departmental machines, the safe working load shall be notified by the Electrical Engineer-in-Charge. As regards contractor's machines the contractors shall notify the safe working load of the machine to the Engineer-in-Charge whenever he brings any machinery to site of work and get it verified by the electrical Engineerconcerned.
- 12. Motors, gearing, transmission, electric wiring and other dangerous parts of hoisting appliances should be provided with efficient safeguards. Hoisting appliances should be provided with such means as will reduce to the minimum the risk of accidental descent of the load. Adequate precautions should be taken to reduce to the minimum the risk of any part of a suspended load becoming accidentally displaced. When workers are employed on electrical installations which are already energized, insulating mats, wearing apparel, such as gloves, sleeves and boots as may be necessary should be provided. The worker should not wear any rings, watches and carry keys or other materials which are good conductors of electricity.
- 13. All scaffolds, ladders and other safety devices mentioned or described herein shall be maintained in safe condition and no scaffold, ladder or equipment shall be altered or removed while it is in use. Adequate washing facilities should be provided at or near places ofwork.



- 14. These safety provisions should be brought to the notice of all concerned by display on a notice board at a prominent place at work spot. The person responsible for compliance of the safety code shall be named therein by the contractor.
- 15. To ensure effective enforcement of the rules and regulations relating to safety precautions the arrangements made by the contractor shall be open to inspection by the Labour Officer or Engineer-in- Charge of the department or their representatives.
- 16. Notwithstanding the above clauses from (1) to (15), there is nothing in these to exempt the contractor from the operations of any other Act or Rules in force in the Republic ofIndia.



# MODEL RULES FOR THE PROTECTION OF HEALTH AND SANITARY ARRANGEMENTS FORWORKERS EMPLOYED BY AAI OR ITS CONTRACTORS

#### 1. APPLICATION

These rules shall apply to all buildings and construction works in charge of AAI in which twenty or more workers are ordinarily employed or are proposed to be employed in any day during the period during which the contract work is in progress.

#### 2. **DEFINITION**

Work place means a place where twenty or more workers are ordinarily employed in connection with construction work on any day during the period during which the contract work is in progress.

#### 3. FIRST-AIDFACILITIES

- (i) At every work place, there shall be provided and maintained, so as to be easily accessible during working hours, first-aid boxes at the rate of not less than one box for 150 contract labour or part thereof ordinarily employed.
- (ii) The first-aid box shall be distinctly marked with a red cross on white back ground and shall contain the following equipment.
- (a) For work places in which the number of contract labour employed does not exceed 50 Each first –aid box shall contain the following equipments:
- 1. 6 small sterilizeddressings
- 2. 3 medium size sterilizeddressings
- 3. 3 large size sterilizeddressings
- 4. 3 large sterilized burndressings
- 5. 1 (30 ml) bottle containing a two per cent alcoholic solution ofiodine.
- 6. 1 (30 ml) bottle containing salvolatile having the dose and mode of administration indicated on the label.
- 7. 1 snakebitelancet.
- 8. 1 (30 gms) bottle of potassium permanganatecrystals.
- 9. 1 pairscissors.
- 10. 1copy of the first-aid leaflet issued by the Director General, Factory Advice Service and Labour Institute, Government of India.
- 11. 1 bottle containing 100 tablets (each of 5 gms) of aspirin.
- 12. Ointment for burns.
- 13. A bottle of suitable surgical antiseptic solution.
- (b) For work places in which the number of contract labour exceed 50. Each first-aid box shall contain the following equipments.
- 1. 12 small sterilized dressings.
- 2. 6 medium size sterilizeddressings.
- 3. 6 large size sterilizeddressings
- 4. 6 large size sterilized burndressings.
- 5. 6 (15 gms) packets sterilized cotton wool.
- 6. 1 (60 ml). Bottle containing two per cent alcoholic solutioniodine.
- 7. 1 (60 ml) bottle containing salvolatile having the dose and mode of administration indicated on the label.
- 8. 1 roll of adhesiveplaster.
- 9. 1 snake bitelancet.
- 10. 1 (30 gms) bottle of potassium permanganatecrystals.
- 11. 1 pairscissors.
- 12. 1 copy of the first-aid leaflet issued by the Director General Factory Advice Service and Labour Institute / Government of India.
- 13. A bottle containing 100 tablets (each of 5 gms) of aspirin.



- 14. Ointment for burns.
- 15. A bottle of suitable surgical antiseptic solution.
- (iii) Adequate arrangements shall be made for immediate recoupment of the equipment when necessary.
- (iv) Nothing except the prescribed contents shall be kept in the First-aidbox.
- (v) The first-aid box shall be kept in charge of a responsible person who shall always be readily available during the working hours of the workplace.
- (vi) a person in charge of the First-aid box shall be a person trained in First-aid treatment in the work places where the number of contract labour employed is 150 ormore.
- (vii) In work places where the number of contract labour employed is 500 or more and hospital facilities are not available within easy distance from the works. First-aid posts shall be established and run by a trained compounder. The compounder shall be on duty and shall be available at all hours when the workers are atwork.
- (viii) Where work places are situated in places which are not towns or cities, a suitable motor transport shall be kept readily available to carry injured person or person suddenly taken ill to the nearesthospital.

#### 4. DRINKINGWATER

- i) In every work place, there shall be provided and maintained at suitable places, easily accessible to labour, a sufficient supply of cold water fit fordrinking.
- ii) Where drinking water is obtained from an intermittent public water supply, each work place shall be provided with storage where such drinking water shall bestored.
- iii) Every water supply or storage shall be at a distance of not less than 50 feet from any latrine drain or other source of pollution. Where water has to be drawn from an existing well which is within such proximity of latrine, drain or any other source of pollution, the well shall be properly chlorinated before water is drawn from it for drinking. All such wells shall be entirely closed in and be provided with a trap door which shall be dust andwaterproof.
- iv) A reliable pump shall be fitted to each covered well, the trap door shall be kept locked and opened only for cleaning or inspection which shall be done at least once amonth.

#### 5. WASHINGFACILITIES

- i) In every work place adequate and suitable facilities for washing shall be provided and maintained for the use of contract labour employed therein.
- ii) Separate and adequate cleaning facilities shall be provided for the use of male and femal workers.
- iii) Such facilities shall be conveniently accessible and shall be kept in clean and hygienic condition.

#### 6. LATRINES ANDURINALS

- i) Latrines shall be provided in every work place on the following scalenamely:
  - a) Where female are employed, there shall be at least one latrine for every 25females.
  - b) Where males are employed, there shall be at least one latrine for every 25males.
- ii) Provided that, where the number of males or females exceeds 100, it shall be sufficient if there is one latrine for 25 males or females as the case may be upto the first 100, and one for every 50thereafter.
- iii) Every latrine shall be under cover and so partitioned off as to secure privacy, and shall have a proper door andfastenings.
- iv) Construction of latrines: The inside walls shall be constructed of masonry or some suitable heat-resisting nonabsorbent materials and shall be cement washed inside and outside at least once a year, Latrines shall not be of a standard lower than boreholesystem.



- v) (a) Where workers of both sexes are employed, there shall be displayed outside each block of latrine and urinal, a notice in the language understood by the majority of the workers "For Men only" or "For Women Only" as the case maybe.
  - (b) The notice shall also bear the figure of a man or of a woman, as the case may be.
- vi) There shall be at least one urinal for male workers upto 50 and one for female workers upto fifty employed at a time, provided that where the number of male or female workmen, as the case may be exceeds 500, it shall be sufficient if there is one urinal for every 50 males or females upto the first 500 and one for every 100 or partthereafter.
- vii) (a) The latrines and urinals shall be adequately lighted and shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition at alltimes.
  - (b) Latrines and urinals other than those connected with a flush sewage system shall comply with the requirements of the Public Health Authorities.
- viii) Water shall be provided by means of tap or otherwise so as to be conveniently accessible in or near the latrines andurinals.
- ix) Disposal of excreta: Unless otherwise arranged for by the local sanitary authority, arrangements for proper disposal of excreta by incineration at the work place shall be made by means of a suitable incinerator. Alternately excreta may be disposed of by putting a layer of night soil at the bottom of a pucca tank prepared for the purpose and covering it with a 15 cm. Layer of waste or refuse and then covering it with a layer of earth for a fortnight (when it will turn tomanure).
- x) The contractor shall at his own expense, carry out all instructions issued to him by the Engineer-in-Charge to effect proper disposal of night soil and other conservancy work in respect of the contractor's workmen or employees on the site. The contractor shall be responsible for payment of any charges which may be levied by Municipal or Cantonment Authority for execution of such on hisbehalf.

#### 7. PROVISION OF SHELTER DURINGREST

At every place there shall be provided, free of cost, four suitable sheds, two for meals and the other two for rest separately for the use of men and women labour. The height of each shelter shall not be less than 3 meters (10 ft.) from the floor level to the lowest part of the roof. These shall be kept clean and the space provided shall be on the basis of 0.6 sq.m. (6 sft) per head. Provided that the Engineer-in-Charge may permit subject to his satisfaction, a portion of the building under construction or other alternative accommodation to be used for the purpose.

#### 8. CRECHES

- i) At every work place, at which 20 or more women workers are ordinarily employed, there shall be provided two rooms of reasonable dimensions for the use of their children under the age of six years. One room shall be used as a play room for the children and the other astheirbedroom. The rooms shall be constructed with specifications as perclause 19H (ii) a,b & c.
- ii) The rooms shall be provided with suitable and sufficient openings for light and ventilation. There shall be adequate provision of sweepers to keep the placesclean.
- iii) The contractor shall supply adequate number of toys and games in the play room and sufficient number of cots and beddings in the bedroom.
- iv) The contractor shall provide one ayaa to look after the children in the crèche when the number of women workers does not exceed 50 and two when the number of women workers exceed 50.
- v) The use of the rooms earmarked as crèches shall be restricted to children, their attendants and mothers of thechildren.



#### 9. CANTEENS

- i) In every work place where the work regarding the employment of contractor labour is likely to continue for six months and where in contract labour numbering one hundred or more are ordinarily employed, an adequate canteen shall be provided by the contractor for the use of such contractlabour.
- ii) The canteen shall be maintained by the contractor in an efficient manner.
- iii) The canteen shall consist of at least a dining hall, kitchen, storeroom, pantry and washing places separately for workers andutensils.
- iv) The canteen shall be sufficiently lighted at all times when any person has access toit.
- v) The floor shall be made of smooth and impervious materials and inside walls shall be limewashed or colour washed at least once in each year. Provided that the inside walls of the kitchen shall be lime washed every fourmonths.
- vi) The premises of the canteen shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition.
- vii) Waste water shall be carried away in suitable covered drains and shall not be allowed to accumulate so as to cause anuisance.
- viii) Suitable arrangements shall be made for the collection and disposal of garbage.
- ix) The dining hall shall accommodate at a time 30 per cent of the contract labour working at atime.
- x) The floor area of the dining hall, excluding the area occupied by the service counter and any furniture except tables and chairs shall not be less than one square metre (10 sft) per diner to be accommodated as prescribed in sub-Rule(ix).
- xi) (a) A portion of the dining hall and service counter shall be partitioned off and reserved for women workers in proportion to their number. (b) Washing places for women shall be separate and screened to secure privacy.
- xii) Sufficient tables stools, chairs or benches shall be available for the number of diners to be accommodated as prescribed in sub-Rule (ix).
- xiii) (a) 1. There shall be provided and maintained sufficient utensils crockery, furniture and any other equipment necessary for the efficient running of thecanteen.
  - 2. The furniture utensils and other equipment shall be maintained in a clean and hygienic condition.
  - (b) 1. Suitable clean clothes for the employees serving in the canteen shall be provided andmaintained.
  - 2. A service counter, if provided, shall have top of smooth and impervious material.
  - 3. Suitable facilities including an adequate supply of hot water shall be provided for the cleaning of utensils and equipments.
- xiv) The food stuffs and other items to be served in the canteen shall be in conformity with the normal habits of the contractlabour.
- xv) The charges for food stuffs, beverages and any other items served in the canteen shall be based on 'No Profit, No loss' and shall be conspicuously displayed in thecanteen.
- xvi) In arriving at the price of foodstuffs, and other article served in the canteen, the following items shall not be taken into consideration as expenditure namely:
  - a) The rent of land andbuilding.
  - b) The depreciation and maintenance charges for the building and equipments provided for thecanteen.
  - c) The cost of purchase, repairs and replacement of equipments including furniture, crockery, cutlery andutensils.
  - d) The water charges and other charges incurred for lighting andventilation.
  - e) The interest and amounts spent on the provision and maintenance of equipments provided for thecanteen.
- xvii) The accounts pertaining to the canteen shall be audited once every 12 months by registered accountants and auditors.



#### 10. ANTI-MALARIAL PRECAUTIONS

The contractor shall at his own expense, conform to all anti-malarial instructions given to him by the Engineer-in-Charge including the filling up of any borrow pits which may have been dug by him.

11. The above rules shall be incorporated in the contracts and in notices inviting tenders and shall form an integral part of thecontracts.

#### 12. AMENDMENTS

AAI may, from time to time, add to or amend these rules and issue directions - it may consider necessary for the purpose of removing any difficulty which may arise in the administrationthereof.



# AIRPORTS AUTHORITY OF INDIA Contractor's Labour Regulations

#### 1. SHORTTITLE

These regulations may be called the AAI Contractors Labour Regulations.

#### 2. **DEFINITIONS**

- (i) **Workman** means any person employed by AAI or its contractor directly or indirectly through a subcontractor with or without the knowledge of the AAI to do any skilled, semiskilled or unskilled manual, supervisory, technical or clerical work for hire or reward, whether the terms of employment are expressed or implied but does not include any person:-
- a) Who is employed mainly in a managerial or administrative capacity:or
- b) Who, being employed in a supervisory capacity draws wages exceeding five hundred rupees per mensem or exercises either by the nature of the duties attached to the office or by reason of powers vested in him, functions mainly of managerial nature or
- c) Who is an out worker, that is to say, person to whom any article or materials are given out by or on behalf of the principal employers to be made up cleaned, washed, altered, ornamental finished, repaired adopted or otherwise processed for sale for the purpose of the trade or business of the principal employers and the process is to be carried out either in the home of the out worker or in some other premises, not being premises under the control and management of the principal employer. No person below the age of 14 years shall be employed to act as aworkman.
- (ii) Fair Wages means wages whether for time or piece work fixed and notified under the provisions of the Minimum Wages Act from time totime.
- (iii) **Contractors** shall include every person who undertakes to produce a given result other than a mere supply of goods or articles of manufacture through contract labour or who supplies contract labour for any work and includes asubcontractor.
- (iv) Wages shall have the same meaning as defined in the Payment of WagesAct.
- 3. i) Normally working hours of an adult employee should not exceed 9 hours a day. The working day shall be so arranged that inclusive of interval for rest, if any, it shall not spread over more than 12 hours on anyday.
  - ii) When an adult worker is made to work for more than 9 hours on any day or for more than 48 hours in any week, he shall be paid over time for the extra hours put in by him at double the ordinary rate ofwages.
  - iii) a) Every worker shall be given a weekly holiday normally on a Sunday, in accordance with the provisions of the Minimum Wages (Central) Rules 1960 as amended from time to time irrespective of whether such worker is governed by the Minimum Wages Act ornot.
  - b) Where the minimum wages prescribed by the Central/State Government under the Minimum Wages Act are not inclusive of the wages for the weekly day of rest, the worker shall be entitled to rest day wages at the rate applicable to the next preceding day, provided he has worked under the same contractor for a continuous period of not less than 6days.
  - c) Where a contractor is permitted by the Engineer-in-Charge to allow a worker to work on a normal weekly holiday, he shall grant a substituted holiday to him for the whole day on one of the five days immediately before or after the normal weekly holiday and pay wages to such worker for the work performed on the normal weekly holiday at overtimerate.

#### 4. DISPLAY OF NOTICE REGARDING WAGESETC.

The contractor shall before he commences his work on contract, display and correctly maintain and continue to display and correctly maintain in a clear and legible condition in conspicuous places on the work, notices in English and in the local Indian languages spoken by the majority of the workers giving the minimum rates of wages fixed under Minimum Wages Act, the actual wages being paid, the hours of work for which such wage are earned, wages periods, dates of payments of wages and other relevant information as per Appendix'VIII'.



#### 5. PAYMENT OFWAGES

- (i) The contractor shall fix wage periods in respect of which wages shall be payable.
- (ii) No wage period shall exceed onemonth.
- (iii) The wages of every person employed as contract labour in an establishment or by a contractor where less than one thousand such persons are employed shall be paid before the expiry of seventh day and in other cases before the expiry of tenth day after the last day of the wage period in respect of which the wages are payable.
- (iv) Where the employment of any worker is terminated by or on behalf of the contractor the wages earned by him shall be paid before the expiry of the second working day from the date on which his employment isterminated.
- (v) All payment of wages shall be made on a working day at the work premises and during the working time and on a date notified in advance and in case the work is completed before the expiry of the wage period, final payment shall be made within 48 hours of the last working day.
- (vi) Wages due to every worker shall be paid to him direct or to other person authorised by him in thisbehalf.
- (vii) All wages shall be paid in current coin or currency or inboth.
- (viii) Wages shall be paid without any deductions of any kind except those specified by the Central Government by general or special order in this behalf or permissible under the Payment of Wages Act1956.
- (ix) A notice showing the wages period and the place and time of disbursement of wages shall be displayed at the place of work and a copy sent by the contractor to the Engineer-in-Charge underacknowledgement.
- (x) It shall be the duty of the contractor to ensure the disbursement of wages in the presence of the Senior Superintendent Engg or authorised representative of the Engineer-in-Charge who will be required to be present at the place and time of disbursement of wages by the contractor toworkmen.

Note: In case of payment of wages paid through bank, the contractor shall submit a copy of bank statement for relevant period duly signed by him.

#### 6. FINES AND DEDUCTIONS WHICH MAY BE MADE FROMWAGES

- (i) The wages of a worker shall be paid to him without any deduction of any kind except the following:
  - a) Fines
  - b) Deductions for absence from duty i.e. from the place or the places where by the terms of his employment he is required to work. The amount of deduction shall be in proportion to the period for which he wasabsent.
  - c) Deduction for damage to or loss of goods expressly entrusted to the employed person for custody, or for loss of money or any other deduction which he is required to account, where such damage or loss is directly attributable to his neglect ordefault.
  - d) Deduction for recovery of advances or for adjustment of overpayment of wages, advances granted shall be entered in aregister.
  - e) Any other deduction which the Central Government may from time to timeallow.
- (ii) No fines should be imposed on any worker save in respect of such acts and omissions on his part as have been approved of by the Chief LabourCommissioner.

**Note:** An approved list of Acts and Omissions for which fines can be imposed is enclosed at Appendix-XII.



- (iii) No fine shall be imposed on a worker and no deduction for damage or loss shall be made from his wages until the worker has been given an opportunity of showing cause against such fines or deductions.
- (iv) The total amount of fine which may be imposed in any one wage period on a worker shall not exceed an amount equal to three paise in a rupee of the total wages, payable to him in respect of that wage period.
- (v) No fine imposed on any worker shall be recovered from him by installment, or after the expiry of sixty days from the date on which it wasimposed.
- (vi) Every fine shall be deemed to have been imposed on the day of the act or omission in respect. of which it wasimposed.

#### 7. LABOURRECORDS

- (i) The contractor shall maintain a Register of persons employed on work on contract in Form XIII of the CL(R&A) Central Rules 1971 (AppendixVI)
- (ii) The contractor shall maintain a Muster Roll register in respect of all workmen employed by him on the work under Contract in Form XVI of the CL (R&A) Rules 1971 (AppendixVII).
- (iii) The contractor shall maintain a Wage Register in respect of all workmen employed by himon the work under contract in Form XVII of the CL (R&A) Rules 1971 (AppendixVIII)
- (iv) **Register of accident** The contractor shall maintain a register of accidents in such form as may be convenient at the work place but the same shall include the following particulars:
  - (a) Full particulars of the labourers who met withaccident.
  - (b) Rate of Wages
  - (c) Sex
  - (d) Age
  - (e) Nature of accident and cause ofaccident
  - (f) Time and date ofaccident
  - (g) Date and time when admitted inHospital
  - (h) Date of discharge from the Hospital
  - (i) Period of treatment and result oftreatment
  - (j) Percentage of loss of earning capacity and disability as assessed by Medicalofficer
  - (k) Claim required to be paid under Workmen's CompensationAct.
  - (1) Date of payment of compensation
  - (m) Amount paid with details of the person to whom the same waspaid
  - (n) Authority by whom the compensation was assessed.
  - (o) Remarks
- (v) The contractor shall maintain a **Register of Fines** in the Form XII of the CL(R&A) Rules 1971(Appendix-XIII).
  - The contractor shall display in a good condition and in a conspicuous place of work the approved list of acts and omissions for which fines can be imposed (Appendix-XII)
- (vi) The contractor shall maintain a **Register of deductions for damage or loss** in Form XX of the CL (R&A) Rules 1971(Appendix-XIV)
- (vii) The contractor shall maintain a **Register of Advances** in Form XXIII of the CL (R&A) Rules 1971(Appendix-XV)
- (viii) The contractor shall maintain a **Register of Overtime** in Form XXIII of the CL (R&A) Rules 1971(Appendix-XVI).

#### 8. ATTENDANCE CARD-CUM-WAGESLIP

- (i) The contractor shall issue an **Attendance card-cum-wage** slip to each workman employed by him in the specimen form at(Appendix-IX)
- (ii) The card shall be valid for each wageperiod.
- (iii) The contractor shall mark the attendance of each workman on the card twice each day, once at the commencement of the day and again after the rest interval, before he actually startswork.
- (iv) The card shall remain in possession of the worker during the wage period underreference.



- (v) The contractor shall complete the wage slip portion on the reverse of the card at least a day prior to the disbursement of wages in respect of the wage period underreference.
- (vi) The contractor shall obtain the signature or thumb impression of the worker on the wage slip at the time of disbursement of wages and retain the card withhimself.

#### 9. EMPLOYMENTCARD

The contractor shall issue an **Employment Card** in Form XIV of the CL (R&A) Central Rules 1971 to each worker within three days of the employment of the worker(Appendix-X).

#### 10. SERVICECERTIFICATE

On termination of employment for any reason whatsoever the contractor shall issue to the workman whose services have been terminated, a **Service certificate** in Form XV of the CL(R&A) Central Rules 1971.

#### 11. PRESERVATION OF LABOURRECORDS

All records required to be maintained under Regulations Nos. 6 & 7 shall be preserved in original for a period of three years from the date of last entries made in them and shall be made available for inspection by the Engineer-in-Charge or Labour Officer or any other officers authorised by the Ministry of Urban Development in this behalf.

#### 12. POWER OF LABOUR OFFICER TO MAKE INVESTIGATIONS ORENQUIRY

The Labour Officer or any person authorised by Central Government on their behalf shall have power to make enquiries with a view to ascertaining and enforcing due and proper observance of Fair Wage Clauses and the Provisions of these Regulations. He shall investigate into any complaint regarding the default made by the contractor or subcontractor in regard to such provision.

#### 13. REPORT OF LABOUROFFICER

The Labour Officer or other persons authorised as aforesaid shall submit a report of result of his investigation or enquiry to the Engineer-in-Charge concerned indicating the extent, if any, to which the default has been committed with a note that necessary deductions from the contractor's bill be made and the wages and other dues be paid to the labourers concerned. In case an appeal is made by the contractor under Clause 13 of these regulations, actual payment to labourers will be made by the Engineer-in-Charge after G.M. Engg. has given his decision on such appeal.

(i) Engineer-in-Charge shall arrange payments to the labour concerned within 45 days from the receipt of the report from the Labour Officer or the G.M. Engineer as the case maybe.

#### 14. APPEAL AGAINST THE DECISION OF LABOUROFFICER

Any person aggrieved by the decision and recommendations of the Labour Officer or other person so authorised may appeal against such decision to the Engineer-in-Charge concerned within 30 days from the date of decision, but subject to such appeal, the decision of the officer shall be final and binding upon the contractor.

#### 15. PROHIBITION REGARDING REPRESENTATION THROUGHLAWYER

- (i) A workman shall be entitled to be represented in any investigation or enquiry under these regulations by:
- a) An officer of a registered trade union of which he is amember.
- b) An officer of a federation of trade unions to which the trade union referred to in Clause (a) is affiliated.



- c) Where the employer is not a member of any registered trade union, by an officer of a registered trade union, connected with the industry in which the worker is employed or by any other workman employed in the industry in which the worker isemployed.
- (ii) An employer shall be entitled to be represented in any investigation or enquiry under these regulations by:
- a) An officer of an association of employers of which he is amember.
- b) An officer of a federation of associations of employers to which association referred to in Clause(a) isaffiliated.
- c) Where the employers is not a member of any association of employers, by an officer of association of employer connected with the industry in which the employer is engaged or by any other employer, engaged in the industry in which the employer isengaged.
- (iii) No party shall be entitled to be represented by a legal practitioner in any investigation or enquiry under these regulations.

#### 16. INSPECTION OF BOOKS ANDSLIPS

The contractor shall allow inspection of all the prescribed labour records to any of his workers or to his agent at a convenient time and place after due notice is received or to the Labour Officer or any other person, authorised by the Central Government on his behalf.

#### 17. SUBMISSION OFRETURNS

The contractor shall submit periodical returns as may be specified from time to time.

#### 18. AMENDMENTS

The Central Government/AAI may from time to time add to or amend the regulations and on any question as to the application/interpretation or effect of those regulations the decision of the General Manager (Engg.) concerned shall be final.



#### **INTEGRITY PACT**

The integrity pact shall be signed by both the parties in the following format

#### **AND**

.....represented by ....... of the other part, hereinafter called the "Bidder/Contractor" (which term shall unless excluded by or is repugnant to the context be deemed to include its heirs, representatives, successors and assigns of the Bidder/Contractor)

WHEREAS the Authority is desirous to make its business mechanism more transparent, thus to ensure strict adherence of the aforesaid objectives/goals, the Authority hereby adopts the instrument developed by the renowned international non-governmental organization "Transparency International" (T I ) headquartered in Berlin ( Germany ). The Authority will appoint an Independent External Monitor (IEM) who will monitor the tender process and the execution of the contract for compliance with the principles mentioned above.



#### 1. Commitments of the Authority;

- 1.1 The Authority undertakes that no official of the Authority, connected directly or indirectly with the contract, will demand, take a promise for or accept, directly or through intermediaries, any bribe, consideration, gift, reward, favour or any material or immaterial benefit or any other advantage from the BIDDER, either for themselves or for any person, organization or third party related to the contract in exchange for an advantage in the bidding process, bid evaluation, contracting or implementation process related to thecontract.
- 1.2 The Authority will, during the pre-contact stage, treat all BIDDERs alike, and will provide to all BIDDERs the same information and will not provide any such information to any particular BIDDER which could afford an advantage to that particular BIDDER in comparison to otherBIDDERs.
- 1.3 All the officials of the Authority will report to the appropriate authority office any attempted or completed breaches of the above commitments as well as any substantial suspicion of such abreach.
- In case any such preceding misconduct on the part of such official(s) is reported by the BIDDER to the Authority with full and verifiable facts and the same is prima facie found to be correct by the Authority, necessary disciplinary proceedings, or any other action as deemed fit, including criminal proceedings may be initiated by the Authority and such a person shall be debarred from further dealings related to the contract process. In such a case while an enquiry is being conducted by the Authority the proceedings under the contract would not bestalled.

# 1. Commitments of Bidders/Contractor.

The Bidder/Contractor commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corrupt practice, unfair means and illegal activities during any stage of its bid or during any pre-contract or post-contract stage in order to secure the contract or in furtherance to secure it and in particular commit itself to the following.

- The Bidder/Contractor will not offer, directly or through intermediaries, any bribe, gift, consideration, reward, favour, any material or immaterial benefit or other advantage, commission, fees, brokerage or inducement to any official of the Authority, connected directly or indirectly with the bidding process, or to any person, organization or third party related to the contract in exchange for any advantage in the bidding, evaluation, contracting and implementation of the contract.
- The Bidder/Contactor further undertakes that it has not given, offered or promised to give, directly or indirectly any bribe, gift, consideration, reward, favour, any material or immaterial benefit or other advantage, commission, fees, brokerage or inducement to any official of the Authority or otherwise in procuring the Contract or forbearing to do or having done any act in relation to the obtaining or executionofthecontractoranyothercontractwiththeAuthorityforshowingor



forbearing to show favour or disfavour to any person in relation to the contract or any other contract with the Authority.

- The Bidder / Contactor has not entered and will not enter with other bidders into any undisclosed agreement or understanding, whether formal or informal. This applies in particular to prices, specification, certifications, subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of bids or any actions to restrict competitiveness or to introduce cartelization in the biddingprocess.
- The Bidder/Contractor shall, when presenting his bid, disclose the name and address of agents and representatives and Indian BIDDERs shall disclose their foreign principals or associates.
- The Bidder/Contactor shall when presenting his bid disclose any and all the payments he has made or, is committed to or intends to make to agents/brokers or any other intermediary, in connection with thisbid/contract.
- The Bidder/Contractor further confirms and declares to the Authority that the BIDDER is the original manufacturer/integrator/ authorized government sponsored export entity of the stores and has not engaged any individual or firm or company whether Indian or foreign to intercede, facilitate or in any way to recommend to the Authority or any of its functionaries, whether officially or unofficially to the award of the contract to the BIDDER, nor has any amount been paid, promised or intended to be paid to any such individual, firm or company in respect of any such intercession, facilitation orrecommendation.
- The Bidder/Contractor, either while presenting the bid or during pre-contract negotiations or before signing the contract, shall disclose any payments he has made or has committed to or intends to make to officials of the Authority or their family members, agents, brokers or any other intermediaries in connection with the contract and the details of services agreed upon for suchpayments.
- The Bidder/Contractor will not collude with other parties interested in the contract to impair the transparency, fairness and progress of the bidding process, bid evaluation, contracting and implementation of the contract.
- The Bidder/Contractor will not accept any advantage in exchange for any corrupt practice, unfair means and illegalactivities.
- The Bidder / Contactor shall not use improperly, for purposes of competition or personal gain ,or pass on to others, any information provided by the Authority as part of the business relationship, regarding plans, technical proposals and business details, including information contained in any electronic data carrier. The Bidder / Contractor also under takes to exercise due and adequate care lest any such information isdivulged.
- The Bidder/Contractor will inform to the Independent ExternalMonitor.
  - i) If he receives demand for an illegal/unduepayment/benefit.



- ii) If he comes to know of any unethical or illegalpayment/benefit.
- iii) If he makes any payment to any Authority's associate(s)
- The Bidder/Contactor commits to refrain from giving any complaint directly or through any other manner without supporting it with full and verifiable facts.
- The Bidder/Contactor shall not instigate or cause to instigate any third person to commit any of the actions mentioned above.
- If the Bidder/Contractor or any employee of the Bidder/Contractor or any person acting on behalf of the Bidder/ Contractor, either directly or indirectly, is a relative of any of the officers of the Authority, or alternatively, if any relative of an officer of the Authority has financial interest/stake in the Bidder's/Contractor's firm, the same shall be disclosed by the Bidder/Contractor at the time filing of tender. The term 'relative' for this purpose would be as defined in Section 6 of the Companies Act1956.
- The Bidder/Contractor shall not lend to or borrow any money from or enter into any monetary dealings or transactions, directly or indirectly, with any employee of the Authority.
- That if the Bidder/ Contractor, during tender process or before the award of the contract or during execution of the contract/work has committed a transgression in violation of section 2 or in any other form such as to put his reliability or credibility as Bidder/Contractor into question, the Authority is entitled to disqualify him from the tender process or to terminate the contract for such reason and to debar the BIDDER from participating in future biddingprocesses.

#### 2. PreviousTransgression

- 3.1 The Bidder/Contractor declares that no previous transgression occurred in the last three years immediately before signing of this Integrity Pact, with any other company in any country in respect of any corrupt practices envisaged hereunder or with any Public Sector Enterprise in India or any Government Department in India that could justify Bidders's exclusion from the tenderprocess.
- 3.2 The Bidder/Contractor agrees that if it makes incorrect statement on this subject, he can be disqualified from the tender process or the contract, if already awarded, can be terminated for such reason and he may be considered for debarment for future tender/contractprocesses.
- 3.3 That the Bidder/Contractor undertakes to get this Pact signed by the subcontractor (s) and associate(s) whose value of the work contribution exceeds Rs 0.5 Cr. (Rupees zero point five Cr.) and to submit the same to the Authority along-with the tender document/ contract before contractsigning.
- 3.4. That sub-contractor(s)/ associate(s) engaged by the Contractor, with the approval of the Authority after signing of the contract, and whose value of the work contributionexceedsRs0.5Cr.(RupeesZeropointfiveCr.)willberequiredto



sign this Pact by the Contractor, and the same will be submitted to the Authority before doing/ performing any act/ function by such subcontractor(s) / associate(s) in relation to the contract/ work.

- 3.5 That the Authority will disqualify from the tender process all Bidder(s) who don't sign this Pact or violate its provisions or fails to get this Pact signed in terms of policy of authority
- 3.6 That if the Contractor(s) does/ do not sign this Pact or violate its provisions or fails to get this Pact signed in terms of policy of authority. Authority will terminate the contract and initiate appropriate action against suchContractor(s).
- 4. Earnest Money, Security Deposit, Bank Guarantee, Draft, Pay order or any other mode and its validity i/c Warranty Period, Performance Guarantee/Bond.

While submitting bid, the BIDDER shall deposit an EMD/SD/BG/DRAFT/PAY ORDER ETC I/C WARRANTY PERIOD, PG/BOND, VALIDITY etc., which is as per terms and conditions and details given in NIT / tender documents sold to the Bidders.

- 5. Sanctions for Violations/Disqualification from tender process and exclusion from futureContacts.
- Any breach of the aforesaid provisions by the BIDDER or any one employed by it or acting on its behalf (whether with or without the knowledge of the BIDDER) shall entitle the Authority to take all or any one of the following actions, whereverrequired:
  - i) To immediately call off the pre contract negotiations without assigning any reason or giving any compensation to the BIDDER. However, the proceedings with the other BIDDER(s) wouldcontinue.
  - ii) To immediately cancel the contract, if already signed, without giving any compensation to the BIDDER.
  - iii) If the Authority has disqualified / debarred the Bidder from the tender process prior to the award under section 2 or 3 or 4, the Authority is entitled to forfeit the earnest money deposited/bidsecurity.
  - iv) To recover all sums already paid by the Authority, and in case of an Indian BIDDER with interest thereon at 2% higher than the prevailing Prime Lending Rate of State Bank of India, while in case of a BIDDER from a country other than India with interest thereon at 2% higher than the LIBOR. If any outstanding payment is due to the BIDDER from the Authority in connection with any other contract or any other stores, such outstanding payment could also be utilized to recover the aforesaid sum and interest.



- v) To en-cash the advance bank guarantee and performance bond/warranty bond, if furnished by the BIDDER, in order to recover the payments, already made by the BUYER, along withinterest.
- vi) To cancel all or any other Contracts with the BIDDER. The BIDDER shall be liable to pay compensation for any loss or damage to the Authority resulting from such cancellation/rescission and the Authority shall be entitled to deduct the amount so payable from the money(s) due to the BIDDER.
- vii) To debar the BIDDER from participating in future bidding processes for a minimum period of three years, which may be further extended at the discretion of the Authority.
- viii) To recover all sums paid in violation of this Pact by BIDDER(s) to any middleman or agent or broker with a view to securing the contract.
- ix) In case where irrevocable Letters of Credit have been received in respect of any contract signed by the Authority with the BIDDER, the same shall not beopened.
- x) Forfeiture of Performance Bond in case of a decision by the BUYER to forfeit the same without assigning any reason for imposing sanction for violation of this Pact.
- xi) That if the Authority have terminated the contract under section 2 or 3 or 4 or if the Authority is entitled to terminate the contract under section 2 or 3 or 4, the Authority shall be entitled to demand and recover from the contractor damages equivalent to 5% of the contract value or the amount equivalent to security deposit or performance bank guarantee, whichever is higher.
- xii) That the Bidder / Contractor agrees and undertakes to pay the said amount without protest or demur subject only to condition that if the Bidder/Contractor can prove and establish to the satisfaction of the Authority that the disqualification / debarment of the bidder from the tender process or the termination of the contract after award of the contract has caused no damage to the Authority.
- 5.2 The Authority will be entitled to take allorany of the actions mentioned at para 5.1 above.
- 5.3 (i) to (xii) of this Pact also on the Commission by the BIDDER or any one employed by it or acting on its behalf (whether with or without the knowledge of the BIDDER), of an offence as defined in Chapter IX of the Indian Penal code, 1860 or Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 or any other statute enacted for prevention of corruption.



- That if the Bidder/Contractor applies to the Authority for premature revocation of the debarment and proves to the satisfaction of the Authority that he has installed a suitable and effective corruption prevention system and also restored/recouped the damage, if any, caused by him, the Authority may, if thinks fit, revoke the debarment prematurely considering the facts and circumstances of the case, and the documents/evidence adduced by the Bidder/Contractor for first timedefault.
- 5.5 That a transgression is considered to have occurred if the Authority is fully satisfied with the available documents and evidence submitted along with Independent External Monitor's recommendations/suggestions that no reasonable doubt is possible in thematter.
- The decision of the Authority to the effect that a breach of the provisions of this Pact has been committed by the BIDDER shall be final and conclusive on the BIDDER. However, the BIDDER can approach the Independent External Monitor(s) appointed for the purpose of this Pact.

# 6. Allegations against Bidders/Contractors/ Sub-Contractors/Associates:

That if the Authority receives any information of conduct of a Bidder/ Contractor or Sub- Contractor or of an employee or a representative or an associate of the Bidder, Contractor or Sub- Contractor which constitute corruption, or if the Authority has substantive suspicion in this regard, the Authority will inform the Vigilance Department for appropriate action.

# 7. Independent ExternalMonitor(s),

- 7.1. That the Authority has appointed competent and credible Independent External Monitor(s) for this Pact.
- 7.2 The task of the Monitor(s) is to review independently and objectively, whether and to what extent the parties comply with the obligations under this Pact. He will also enquire into any complaint alleging transgression of any provision of this Pact made by the Bidder, Contractor or Authority.
- 7.3. That the Monitor(s) is not subject to any instructions by the representatives of the parties and would perform his functions neutrally and independently. He will report to the Chairperson of the Board of the Authority.
- 7.4 That the Bidder / Contractor accepts that the Monitor(s) has the right to access without restriction to all project documentation of the Authority including that provided by the Bidder/Contractor. The Bidder/Contractor will also grant the Monitor, upon his request and demonstration of a valid interest, unrestricted and unconditional access to his project documentation including minutes of meeting. The same is applicable to Sub Contractors and Associates. The Monitor is under obligation to treat the information and documents of the Authority and Bidder/ Contractor / Sub- Contractors/ Associates withconfidentiality.
- 7.5. That as soon as the Monitor notices, or believes to notice, a violation of this Pact, hewillsoinformthemanagementoftheAuthorityandrequestthemanagement



todiscontinue or heal the violation, or to take other relevant action. The Monitor(s) can in this regard submit his recommendations/ suggestions. Beyond this, the Monitor(s) has no right to demand from the parties that they act in a specific manner, refrain from action or tolerate action.

- 7.6 That the Authority will provide to the Monitor(s) sufficient information about all meetings among the parties related to the project provided such meetings could have an impact on the contractual relations between the Authority and the Contractor / Bidder. The parties offer to the Monitor(s) the option to participate in such meetings.
- 7.7 That the Monitor(s) will submit a written report to the Chairperson of the Board of the Authority within 2 weeks from the date of reference or intimation to him by the Authority and, should the occasion arise, submit proposals for correcting problematicsituations.
- 7.8 That if the Monitor(s) has reported to the Chairperson of the Board a substantiated suspicion of an offence under relevant Anti- Corruption Laws of India and the Chairperson has not, within reasonable time, taken visible action to proceed against such offence or reported it to the Vigilance Department, the Monitor may also transmit this information directly to the Central Vigilance Commissioner, Government of India.
- 7.9 The word 'Monitor' would include singular andplural.

#### 8. Facilitation of Investigation.

In case of any allegation of violation of any provisions of this Pact or payment of commission, the Authority or its agencies shall be entitled to examine all the documents including the Books of Accounts of the BIDDER and the BIDDER shall provide necessary information and documents in English and shall extend all possible help for the purpose of suchExamination.

#### 9. Law and Place of Jurisdiction.

That this Pact is subject to provisions under Indian Law. The place of performance and jurisdiction is the Corporate Headquarter /the Regional Headquarter / office of the Authority, asapplicable.

# 10. Other LegalActions

- 10.1 That the changes and supplements as well as termination notice need to be made inwriting.
- That if the Bidder / Contractor are a partnership or a consortium, this Pact must be signed by all the partners and consortium members or their authorized representatives.



#### 11. Pact duration(Validity)

- 11.1 That this Pact comes into force when both the parties have signed it. It expires for the Contractor 12 months after the final payment under the respective contract, and for all other Bidders 3 months after the contract isawarded.
- 11.2. That if any claim is made / lodged during this period, the same shall be binding and continue to be valid despite the lapse of this Pact as specified herein before, unless it is discharged/determined by Chairman of the Authority.
- 11.3 That should one or several provisions of this Pact turn out to be invalid; the remainder of this Pact shall remain valid. In this case, the parties will strive to come to an agreement to their original intentions.

#### 12. **Company Code of Conduct**

Bidders are also advised to have a company code of conduct (clearly rejecting the the



- ii) CMC of Displays mentioned in Schedule of Quantity.
- iii) Providing uninterrupted facility of conferencing system at A Block, R.G. Bhawan by deploying adequate manpower.
- iv) Operation and preventive maintenance of PA conferencing system
- v) Extra Hours of manpower beyond specified working days/hours.
- vi) Providing all necessary spares required for operation on need basis.

### 2. Period of Contract: -

The contract shall be for a period of **24 months** from the date of handing over of site. The contract period can be extended for further period of **06 months** on the same terms and conditions of the agreement. AAI reserves the right to terminate the contract fully or partially by giving 30 days' notice in writing to the contractor. If in the opinion of the Engineer-in-Charge, it is observed that the contractor is not doing the works satisfactorily as per the terms and conditions of contract, then the contract can be terminated with immediate effect without giving any reasons thereof.

## 3. Entry Pass: -

The work site lies in restricted area. The contractor shall apply in writing in advance for issue of necessary entry passes of workmen engaged by him, nothing extra shall be paid to the contractor. The office/ airport premises are an essential service covered under the maintenance of essential service Act and hence disruption of services rendered will be a statutory offence. The necessary police verification etc. as required for entry passes will be the responsibility of the contractor. All expenditure towards arranging security passes shall be borne by the Agency.

#### 4. Security: -

The contractor and his employees shall abide by security regulation framed by AAI/ BCAS or Police Authorities. Any worker of the contractor, whose presence is found undesirable in AAI premises, shall not be allowed to work. The Contractor shall be fully responsible for the satisfactorily working of his staff.

"If Contractor or his authorized representative or his employed workers are found violating any of security regulations, suitable action shall be taken by AAI as per prevailing rules".

All men and vehicles shall be permitted to enter the restricted / office area only on possession of the security passes. The contractor shall apply in writing in advance before commencement of work for issue of security passes and shall submit a list of personnel concerned with their addresses. The contractor shall ensure that his men are deployed only in those areas where the security passes issued is valid for. Passes shall be deposited back with Engineer-In-Charge on demand and in any case immediately after completion of work. The contractor or his

representatives shall observe all the rules promulgated from time to time by the concerned authorities. Any person found violating the security rules laid down by the authority will be expelled from the area without assigning any reason whatsoever and contractor shall have no claim on this account.

### 5. <u>Statutory & Regulatory Clauses</u>: -

The contractor has to discharge all the obligations as provided under various statutory enactment including the EPF/ ESI/ Contract Labour (Regulation and abolition)/ Minimum Wages / Payment of Wages / Payment of Bonus /Payment of Gratuity / Workmen's compensation / Works Contract and other relevant Acts, Rules and Regulations in force and as amended from time to time in the State, as applicable.

The engagement and employment of workers and payment of wages to them as per existing provisions of various labour laws and regulations is the sole responsibility of the contractor and any breach of such laws or regulations shall be deemed to be violation of this contract. AAI may ask the contractor to produce documents to verify that these provisions/laws are complied by the contractor.

The contractor has to follow the local security/safety rules & regulations and such instructions on restricted hours of work as may be imposed on him by the department / local authorities, while working in security restricted zones and no claim whatsoever on account of this, will be entertained.

Contractor has to submit the details of staff such as, qualification documents and experience letters of the staff, the CV and passport size coloured photograph along with copy of police verification (not older than six months on the date of start of work) before engaging them on work. All the documents should be self-attested by each worker and signed and stamped by contractor/ agency. The decision of Engineer-in-charge, to accept or reject any candidate on the basis of lack of experience, qualification, lack of skills required for job, will be final and binding on the Agency.

#### 6. <u>Uniform</u>: -

The contractor/ agency has to provide every year during the currency of the contract, 2 sets of uniform (pant and shirt), 1 pair of shoes & 3 pair of socks and a sweater (for winter stations only) to his staff of approved colour during the contract period, (within one month from the date of award) failing which, AAI recover an amount of Rs 200/- per person per week till the compliance of the same from the contractor's running/final bill. In the event of non-compliance of wearing uniform & shoes by workers on daily basis a recovery of Rs. 50/-per day per person shall be made from running bills. The workers should wear a badge on the left pocket of the shirt mentioning company's name.

7. No accommodation shall be arranged by the AAI for the staff / workers of the contractor. It is the responsibility of contractor to make his own arrangements for the facilities.

#### 8. Rates: -

i. Rates to be quoted by the parties, should be inclusive of all taxes, duties, CESS, fee, royalty charges etc. levied under any statute but exclusive of GST for all the items.

- ii. However, GST, as applicable, shall be paid to the contractor, for any taxable Supply /services/construction rendered by the agency to AAI against a valid GST invoice as per terms and conditions of the contract and no additional amount such as contractor's overhead and profit will be paid on this account.
- iii. The prices quoted shall also exclusive of EPF and ESI. EPF & ESI amount paid to the statutory authorities by the contractor shall be reimbursed on actual basis and as per applicable rules throughout the contract period on submission of the documentary evidence in next bill or after the final bill and no additional amount such as contractor's overhead and profit will be paid on this account.
- iv. Bonus amount as per latest Govt. rules or 8.33% of annual salary whichever is higher will be paid to the deployed manpower by the contractor and the same shall be reimbursed on actual basis throughout the contract period on submission of the documentary evidence in next bill or after the final bill and no additional amount such as contractor's overhead and profit will be paid on this account.
- v. In case of nonpayment of bonus necessary recovery/withheld against bonus from their RA Bill / Final bill shall be made as decided by EIC and appropriate action will be initiated by AAI against the contractor. The decision of EIC in the regard will be final and binding on the Agency.

## 9. PF & ESIC Contribution: -

- (i) The contractor shall register himself with Labour Licensing Authority and obtain Labour License Number in this regard.
- (ii) The contractor shall have to register with PF & ESIC (where ever applicable) for workmen engaged for the work & challans / deposit receipts of PF & ESI contribution shall be submitted in AAI office for verification/ reimbursement, at the time of submission of bill.
- (iii) The PF dues (including EDLI and administrative charges) in respect of workers engaged by the contractor for AAI works to be deposited by the contractor every month by a challan and the documentary evidence in support of such payments along-with employee wise details of the PF contribution (both Employee's share and the employer's contribution) needs to be submitted to the Engineer in charge for the work/contract.
- (iv) ESI (where ever applicable) & EPF amount (contractor's contribution & administrative charges) paid to the statutory authorities by the contractor shall be reimbursed on actual basis on submission of documentary evidence.
- (v) If ESI not applicable, the agency shall provide Rs. 2.0 lacs Mediclame policy to each person engaged at the site.
- (vi) The contractor has to deposit PF & ESI as applicable, failing which recovery/ with-held @ 26 % and 6 % against PF and ESI respectively from their R.A bills/ Final Bill shall be made.

### 10 <u>Labour Wages</u>:-

- (i) The contractor has to pay the prevailing minimum wages issued by the office of Regional Labour Commissioner/ Chief Labour Commissioner (whichever is higher), from time to time. However, the difference in minimum wages based on actual payment made to the labour and wages applicable at the time of submission of tender will be reimbursed including difference in EPF and ESI payment to the contractor on revision of minimum wages and no additional amount such as contractor's overhead & profit will be paid on this account
- (ii) For the purpose of admitting the claim for reimbursement of statutory increase in wages paid by him, the contractor has to produce the required documentary evidence to the satisfaction of Engineer-In-Charge.
- (iii) The payment to the workmen's engaged by the contractor is to be paid through NEFT/ RTGS/ Cheque on or before 7th of every month irrespective of Saturday, Sunday and bank holidays. If any violation with respect to payment of wages found, the recovery @ Rs. 50/- per day per employee against period of delay shall be made from running or final bill as a penalty.
- 11. During the contract period if any new installations are added / replaced or modified the existing ones in these areas, which do not warrant any additional manpower, the maintenance services for these installations are also to be provided by the contractor without any extra cost.

#### 12. Manpower Assessment & Qualification of Staff: -

The tenderer is advised to quote his rates after inspecting all the areas and installations falling under the scope of work / available at site and assess the requirement of the technically skilled and physically sound manpower for providing smooth and reliable services. However, the contractor shall deploy the following minimum staff for operation & maintenance of various installations on all weekdays but exclusive on Sunday and Gazetted Holidays. But in case of any requirement on Sunday & Gazetted Holidays, the contractor has to arrange the required manpower for smooth operation of system. The payment for working on such requirement will be given as per schedule item for extra hours.

a) For SH-11, Item No. 2.01 of Schedule of Quantities.

In case of major preventive maintenance & breakdown maintenance, the adequate and technically skilled manpower shall be assessed and deployed at site in addition to above and no extra payment shall be made for this. AAI has full liberty to rearrange & utilize the above staff wherever it desires as per its own requirement in other blocks at RGB.

The staff deployed shall carry out routine checks and record all the data in log books/complaint book etc.

(i) **System Operator (Skilled):** - Shall be I.T.I./ Diploma holder in Electronics/ Electrical/ IT/ Computer Science or equivalent with minimum 1 years' experience in similar works or trade license with minimum 2-year experience in similar works / field and shall be paid as per minimum wages of the category.

The contractor shall comply all the labour regulations applicable in respect of the manpower engaged by them under this contract. The contractor is fully responsible for the competencies, character and conduct of the personnel being deployed by them.

However, Engineer-in-charge reserves the right to relax above mentioned educational requirement and experience criteria for any specialized skilled person suitable to site requirements.

13. In case of absence of staff from duty recovery will be made by the department at the following rates, which shall be binding on the contractor.

i. Skilled : As per daily wages

But apart from daily wages, an amount of Rs. 100/- will be recovered from the agency per person per shift for absenteeism of any worker as a penalty.

The EIC has full rights to instruct the agency to expel/ replace the person with the regular habit of taking unauthorized leaves frequently or continuously absent without proper justification, which may impact the morale of co-workers.

- 14. Preventive maintenance checks are attached in Annexure "I".
- It is the responsibility of the contractor to maintain and ensure 100% serviceability of the equipment's / installations under this contract, except for the reasons beyond the control of the contractor. The decision of engineer-in-charge is final and binding on the contractor in respect of establishment & "the reason beyond the control of the contractor". If the failure to maintain the serviceability of installations attributed to the contractors / agency, penalty to be imposed on the contractor as deemed fit by the Engineer in Charge. Special care is required in attending the faults for the equipment's where no standby is available. At the completion of contract all the units shall be handed over to AAI in good condition.
- 16. In case the agency is not able to attend/ rectify fault in the system within the stipulated time period, AAI reserves the rights to engage outside agency to check / inspect the faulty system. If the system is rectified by the outside agency or third party, the amount of checking, rectification along with suitable penalty towards delay in attending breakdown shall be recovered from the agency. Who otherwise is responsible for the up keeping of this equipments.
- 17. There shall be no liability on the part of the AAI to pay any compensation arising out of the labour dispute, accident etc. at site. The contractor will be fully responsible for safety, security and coordination of the workers deployed at AAI site. Noting extra will be paid to the Agency on this account.
- 18. Contractor or his authorized representative shall visit the site at least once in one month and as and when called by the Engineer-in-Charge or his representative and will report about satisfactory working of all equipment.
- 19. Any material taken out for the purpose of repair/ rectification/ replacement from the building or work premises shall have necessary permission from the EIC and security personnel/ competent authority in the form of a Gate pass and the same will be taken back in a promised time for smooth services at the site.

- **20.** The timings of operation & maintenance/ upkeep work etc. shall be as decided by Engineer-in-charge from time to time depending upon operational & technical requirement.
- 21. If agency is doing any maintenance work as per schedule then they have to take prior approval for the same from EIC.

### 22. Handing/ Taking over of the Equipment/ Machines after contract: -

#### For CMC Contract

For items under Comprehensive Maintenance Contract, the agency will check the installations thoroughly at the time of taking over and any defect found will be intimated to AAI in writing.

List of defects, if any, notified during contract period shall be rectified by the existing agency before the closure of the contract. If the agency failed to rectify the defects, notified to him (during contract period) the EIC shall rectified the defects at the contractor's risk & cost. The decision of EIC in this regard will be final & binding on the agency.

23. The Contractor has to deploy their staff to run the system on all days as per BOQ.\_In case of labour under a court case that need to be deployed by the agency as directed by E-I-C.

#### 24. Safety & availability of Material: -

- (i) Issue of materials stipulated in the tender will be regulated to the actual needs from time to time. Unused materials shall be returned to the department failing which the recovery will be made at the penal rate i.e. double the market rate. Any damage caused to the materials during transit or under storage will be to the contractor's account.
- (ii) If there is any requirement of material at site which is not available in AAI store then contractor has to procure from market as per approved makes with EIC permission and close the complaint as soon as possible. Contractor will provide the tax invoice/ bill for the same and the payment for such material will be given as extra item and as per relevant clause of GCC.

#### 25. Guarantee: -

In case of supply of any material, the tenderer shall guarantee the equipment/ material against all defects as per manufacturer. Any defects arising during the guarantee period shall be rectified by the Tenderer at his own expenses to the satisfaction of the E-I-C.

#### 26. Water, Electricity: -

The AAI will provide water & Electricity for maintenance purpose, free of cost.

#### 27. Make of Items: -

The contractor shall use / supply the material as per approved make of AAI or as per schedule of quantities or exact replacement of existing material suitable to site after taking permission from EIC/authorized representative in writing in case makes are not defined for particular material and the department reserves the right to accept or reject any other makes offered by the contractor.

The contractor has to supply the materials as and when reqd. /ordered by the Engineer-incharge or his representative during the currency of the contract.

#### 28. Terms of payment: -

The Running payments for the work done shall be released **Quarterly** by AAI only after salary payments to all workers & submitting the proof of disbursement and deducting the applicable taxes. The **Security Deposit** @ **10**% shall be deducted from the running bills. In case of partial execution of item, which do not affect the system functionality, measurement of the item is done on pro-rata basis.

The following documents as applicable shall be produced and self-attested photo copy shall be submitted by the contractor during each running bills: -

- a. Monthly Challans of E.P.F. and E.S.I. deposits upto previous month.
- b. Wages register, wage slips signed by workers of each month.
- c. Bonus details received and signed by workers.
- d. Preventive Maintenance Registers.
- e. GST Invoice.

#### 29. Final Bill Payment: -

The total amount of final bill worked out at the accepted tender rates, if found to be more than the amount worked out at the quoted rate of second lowest, the contractor shall be paid lower of the two.

The agency shall submit final bill alongwith all the documents related with PF, ESIC & Bonus to AAI in addition to all maintenance schedule registers, documents etc. related to the work. The agency also formally hand over the list of equipments in good working condition, without any damage as handed over to them by AAI.

#### 30. Security Deposit: -

The security deposit of the contractor shall not be refunded before the expiry of 06 (six) months after the issue of the certificate final or otherwise, of completion of work or till the final bill has been prepared and passed whichever is later.

31. The contractor shall be responsible for any damage caused to any equipment's /building of AAI due to the negligence of the staff. The same shall be made good by the contractor at his cost.

#### 32. Dismantled materials:

- (i) After completion of the work necessary entries regarding major items shall also be made in the register indicating the location where the materials are installed and the balance materials left out need to deposit to AAI store after completion of work.
- (ii) The major dismantled materials shall be duly handed over to Engineer in charge or his authorized representative.

#### 33. Equipment's for Night Working:

In case, it appears, at any stage that the work may not be completed within the stipulated period due to restricted working hours in the day in view of any reasons, the contractor shall execute the work during the night as and when required. Nothing extra shall be payable to contractor for working in night time.


#### 34. Consumables: -

All the consumables such as insulation tape, Test Lamps, cotton waste, cable lugs, thimbles, hack-saw blade, etc. will be provided by the contractor. Reserve Stock quantity to be decided by the EIC & nothing extra payment will be made in this regard and the agency has to keep minimum quantity of consumables for one month in stock depending on the actual requirement failing which the material will be arranged by the AAI and the expenditure will be recovered from the agency with 15% over head as per the decision of EIC.


#### 35. Tools and Tackles:

The contractor shall provide all the tools and tackles for the works including Measuring instruments and safety gadgets for attending breakdown of equipments. Cost of transportation of tools & tackles, labour and material to Airport/ office premises shall have to be borne by the contractor.

- (i) Each Skilled manpower will be provided with the following minimum tools of reputed brand along with carrying bag for routine maintenance works: -
- Cutting pliers
  Screw Drivers (Big & Small)
  Wire strippers
  Line Testers
  Test Lamps with holder
- (ii) The following tools shall be provided by the agency at AAI store/ use for use of maintenance and breakdown works: -



(iii) The following instruments/ items shall be provided by the agency at AAI store/ powerhouse for use of maintenance and breakdown works: -



#### 36. Guidance to Tenderer:

The contractor shall quote the tender based on the expenditure towards comprehensive maintenance of PA/ conferencing system, providing of manpower (based on minimum wages) Tool & Plants, Uniform to workers, Statutory items, PIC Charges Cost of consumables, miscellaneous expenses, taxes & duties etc.

#### 37. All the Logbooks & Records

Contractor has to provide printed logbook & register at the site within the 10 days of award of contract and maintained by the contractor at the site. The format of logbooks will be approved by engineer-in –charge. In case of required additional quantity may be provided by the contractor at no extra cost to.

- i. Complaints register.
- ii. Preventive maintenance registers/log book for daily, weekly, monthly & yearly records as required at site.
- iii. Attendance registers for staff.
- iv. MAS register.

## 38. Penalty Clause:

- (a) <u>For delay in attending complaints and breakdown: -</u> No total Breakdown is acceptable. In case of total Breakdown due to negligence of the contractor or his workmen, suitable recovery proposed by Engineer-In-Charge will be final and binding on the contractor. Special care is required in attending the faults for the equipments where no standby is available.
- i) All complaints where no spare parts required to attend the complaint, such type of complaints need to be attended within 8 hours from the time of intimation of complaint, failing which a penalty @ Rs. 300/- per day per complaint basis shall be recovered.
- ii) All complaints where any major spare parts required to attend the complaint, such type of complaints need to be attended within 24 hours from the time of intimation of complaint, failing which a Penalty @ Rs. 1000/- per day per complaint basis shall be recovered.
- iii) If any system declared on "DOWN" shall be attended immediate on priority after getting information on Phone/Mail/ Whatsapp/ Fax/ in person etc. from AAI. Firm has to attend the unit in minimum time frame or as allowed by Engineer-In-Charge. If firm is failed to attend, so, AAI is free to get repair the defective units on firms' risk & cost without given any further notice in writing to them. In addition to above a penalty of Rs.5000/- shall be imposed for each incidence apart from the cost of repair from market/ any other agency.
- iv) Contractor shall make the work site clean and tidy after completing the work and no waste material or dust shall be left in the work site. Non-removal of debris from site will attract a penalty of Rs. 500/- per day from the running bill/final bill.
- **(b)** For delay in attending maintenance schedules: All the preventive maintenance works shall be done as per schedule and complete records in those regards has to be prepared and submitted to AAI engineers, failing which recovery of Rs. 500/- for Daily checks, Rs. 1,000/- for weekly maintenance, Rs.1500/- for monthly maintenance and Rs. 2,000/- for quarterly maintenance shall be made from the bills for each set/system of installations, subject to the shutdown provided by AAI, which shall be Co- ordinate by the agency.

<u>Note</u> :- In any case the total penalty at any point of time on account of any or all the categories put together shall not exceed 15 % of the total contract value.

If any equipment damaged due to the negligence of the manpower, the agency shall repair the same and nothing extra shall be paid on this account by the AAI.

Once the total penalty reaches this limit, the contract shall be liable for review / rescind as per the provisions of the contract agreement and the decision of Engineer-in-Charge in this regard shall be final and binding on the contractor.

### Annexure-I

#### Maintenance Procedures, & Maintenance Schedules

#### 1 Procedure to be followed for Maintenance

The following events/procedures shall follow the registration of a complaint from a user and maintenance of system under contract:

- 1.1 Give a unique fault / Complaint number.
- 1.2 Identify the nature of fault & the faulty components.
- 1.3 Prepare a detailed report on nature of fault and hand over the report to the maintenance / retainer contractor.
- 1.4 A complete history of each fault shall be maintained & necessary formats required for this purpose shall be prepared as agreed mutually.
- 1.5 Acceptance of system after maintenance and closure of cases.
- Maintenance Matrix / Schedule: The firm's service engineer shall make quarterly visit to the site and in case of any breakdown calls during the currency of contract, the firm shall attend the breakdown calls within 24 hours of intimation over phone without any extra cost. The rates quoted/accepted shall be firm and final shall be inclusive the same.

The periodical maintenance activities are categorized as follows:

- 2.1 General Cleaning this will include cleaning of equipments externally/Internally.
- 2.2 Precaution: Equipment should not be isolated without proper authorization. Each cleaning has to be recorded.

#### 2.3 Preventive maintenance includes the following activities.

- 2.3.1 Periodic internal cleaning of the equipment (using blowers).
- 2.3.2 Regular checking of earth connections of the power supply (once in a month)
- 2.3.3 Each preventive maintenance has to be recorded.

#### Scope of Repairs & Maintenance 2.4

- 2.4.1 The scope of each maintenance shall depend on the nature / category of faults.
  2.4.2 The table below indicates the various maintenance activities & their periodicity.
