Blacktown City Council (Council) is seeking tenders for the Demolition Contract for the Animal Holding Facility (AHF) located at 415 Flushcombe Rd, Blacktown. The works involve the demolition, removal and disposal of the all existing structures and paved areas on the site including the AHF building, site caretaker's residence, various animal holding structures, septic tanks, on-grade carpark and access road.

The Council is currently constructing the Blacktown Animal Rehoming Centre (BARC) at Owen Street, Glendenning and upon its completion, all staff, animals, equipment and operations of the existing AHF will be relocated to the new BARC facility and the AHF demolition works will commence. The Council is seeking to clear all the buildings, structures and paved areas of the site to provide a clean site in order to assist in the subsequent sale of the land by Council.
