Technical details of Saldanha Bay Municipality's (SBM's) existing ambient air quality network:

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1. Location of Air Quality Monitors and Dust Fallout Buckets
Saldanha Bay Municipality established an ambient air quality and dust fallout monitoring network, that has been operational since July 2014.
 - 1.1 The 2 x Ambient Air Quality Stations are housed in non-movable trailers located at the following co-ordinates:
Station Vredenburg: 33054'6.20"S, 17059'31.94"E
Station Saldanha: 3300'3.99"S, 17056'41.68"E
 - 1.2 The Ambient Air Quality Stations consist of the following analysers:
 - 1.2.1 Teledyne (T200) Nitrogen oxide (NOx) Analyser
 - 1.2.2 Teledyne (T100) Sulfur dioxide (SO2) Analyser
 - 1.2.3 Teledyne (T400) Ozone (O3) Analyser
 - 1.2.4 U.S. EPA Approved PM10 and PM2.5 Equivalent Monitors
 - 1.2.5 Meteorological equipmentNB. Equipment was purchased and commissioned in 2014
 - 1.3 7 x Dust fallout buckets are open topped 5L cylinder containers made of UV resistant weather-proof plastic with a tight lid placed on top of 2.2m high galvanized steel pole and base.
 - 1.3.1 The dust fallout out buckets are located at the following co-ordinates:

PART B:

The main aim of the Saldanha Bay ambient air quality monitoring programme is to ensure that the ambient air quality with the Saldanha Bay Municipality is compliant with national norms and standards. A data validation process to filter out erroneous data is critical to maximise data integrity. The service provider must provide accurate and reliable measurements of air pollutant concentration and meteorological data, to verify and support the dispersion modelling calculations completed as part of the ambient air quality monitoring programme.

2. FREQUENCY OF INSPECTIONS

For all the air quality monitors and dust buckets monthly inspections are required. Details of such frequencies are included in the Pricing Schedule

3. INSPECTIONS

A suitably qualified and experienced consultant will be expected to physically visit and inspect the monitoring sites at required frequencies, note the performance of each unit,

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collect samples and to submit a comprehensive report detailing the data collected and to provide advice on the most efficient way of operating the equipment under prevailing conditions.

4. DUST FALLOUT SAMPLE HANDLING AND ANALYSES

Samples collected by the service provider during their inspection should be suitably preserved and returned to the laboratory for full analysis according to the schedule provided in the pricing schedule.

It must be clearly understood that the quoted prices must include the cost of all arrangements necessary for the actual collection and delivery of samples, as well as, all laboratory costs for analyses of samples, at the relevant sites. quoted prices must include all communication costs required for the relay of information.

The Operation, Management and reporting are to be done on ambient air quality, inclusive of PM10 and PM2.5, NOx, Ozone, SO2/ H2S, Manganese.

5. AIR QUALITY REPORTING

The contractor will be required to submit a written report on each network within 104 days of the date of sampling (Dust fallout including metals) and 3 working days for Ambient Air quality site. Such reports must fulfill the requirements as below.

Reports are to be submitted to the client electronically, supplemented by hard-copy written reports where required.

Reports reflecting data (as agreed upon with Saldanha Bay Municipality) will be submitted to SAAQIS on a monthly basis.

The following requirements apply:

5.1 The station and equipment must be operated and managed in accordance with SANAS TR07-03 requirements.

This includes but is not limited to the following minimums:

- a. Weekly site visits

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- b. Bi-monthly internal zero span checks (every 2 weeks)
 - c. Quarterly on-site dynamic calibration using NMISA Primary Standard Gases

 - (b) B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution.

- 1.6 The purchaser reserves the right to require of a bidder, either before a bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the purchaser.

- (b) **“B-BBEE”** means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (c) **“B-BBEE status level of contributor”** means the B-BBEE status received by a measured entity based on its overall performance using the relevant scorecard contained in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (d) **“bid”** means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of services, works or goods, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- (e) **“Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act”** means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003) as amended by Act No 46 of 2013;
- (f) **“comparative price”** means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can be utilized have been taken into consideration;
- (g) **“consortium or joint venture”** means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- (h) **“contract”** means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by an organ of state;
- (i) **“EME”** means an Exempted Micro Enterprise as defines by Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- (j) **“Firm price”** means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs or excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- (k) **“functionality”** means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- (l) **“non-firm prices”** means all prices other than “firm” prices;
- (m) **“person”** includes a juristic person;
- (n) **“QSE”** means a Qualifying Small Enterprise as defines by Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);

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- (o) **“rand value”** means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- (p) **“sub-contract”** means the primary contractor’s assigning, leasing, making out work to, or employing, another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- (q) **“total revenue”** bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act and promulgated in the *Government Gazette* on 9 February 2007;
- (r) **“trust”** means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and
- (s) **“trustee”** means any person, including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in order for such property to be administered for the benefit of another person.

ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 2.1 The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract.
- 2.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts;.
- 2.3 Points scored must be rounded off to the nearest 2 decimal places.
- 2.4 In the event that two or more bids have scored equal total points, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 2.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 2.6 Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

- 4.6 Tertiary Institutions and Public Entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- 4.7 A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended sub-contractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
